Note this from page 14. "Wolverines were the second animal of choice for two hunters; **but for most harvesters, harvesting of wolverines is incidental.**" This, of course, may be different for "commercial" trapping for the fur trade or taxidermy, but I think this is an important distinction. Do the trapping records you received provide any information on this? Maybe a question for Rick or Bill?
