Hi Judy,

I haven't seen this plan for Atlantic Sunrise. I just tried, but couldn't access the file. What is in of interest?

I just got off the phone with David Chapman, with the Forest Service Rocky Mountain Research Station, who contacted me about MVP mitigation for migratory birds and other species impacts in George Washington and Jefferson National Forest. He is starting to review Virginia's method for estimating forest impacts and mitigation for MVP to determine if they will adopt their analysis or do their own HEA analysis. I suggested he contact DCR's Jason Bullock to discuss the State's methodology since I wasn't familiar with it. I mentioned to him that you had calculated acreage impacts for MVP and he was interested in talking to you about it. Could he contact you? Or I can give you his contact information. He isn't working on ACP at this time, but probably will too.

Also, on our call last month, you indicated that you were planning to proof the acreage calculations for MVP. How is that going?
