

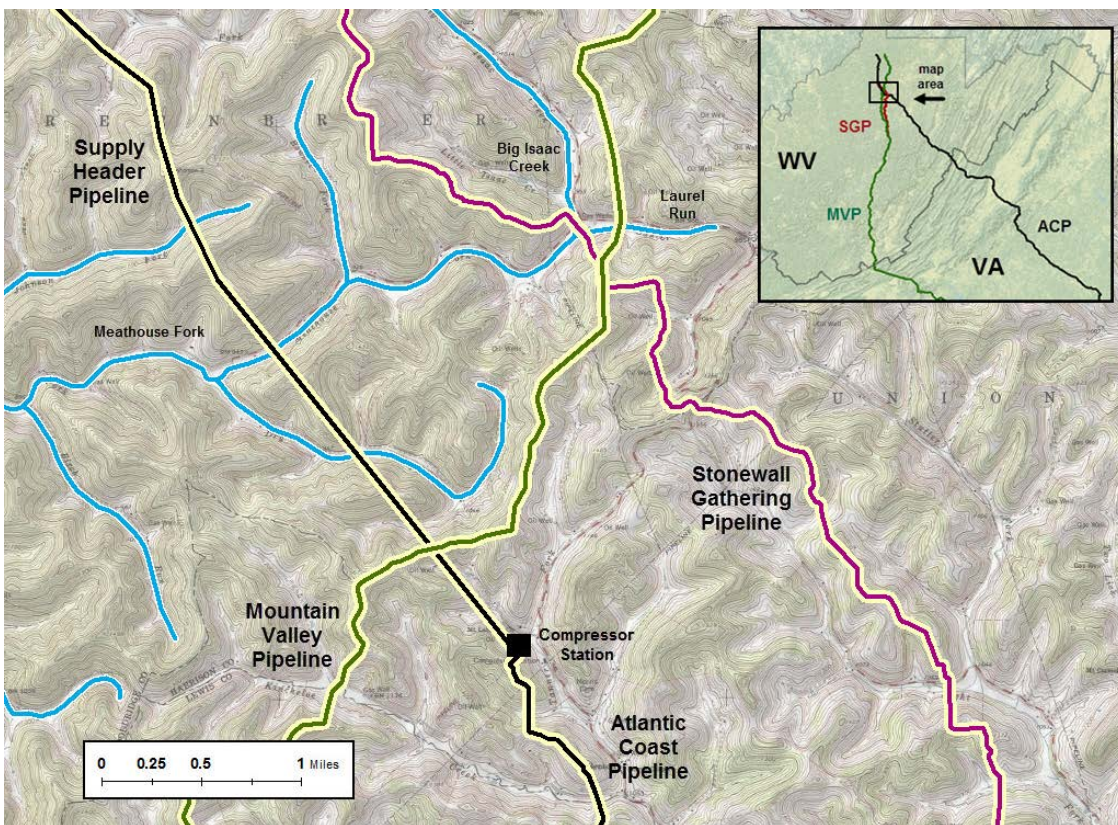
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Subject: STREAM ZERO

A new posting on the [Dominion Pipeline Monitoring Coalition website](#), titled "Stream Zero," is focused on the epicenter of large pipeline construction in the central Appalachian region.

The Stonewall Gathering Pipeline, the Atlantic Coast/Supply Header Pipeline, and the Mountain Valley Pipeline are projected to all converge on a small area in central WV, crossing Meathouse Fork and its tributaries within a single stretch of less than two miles. The Stonewall Gathering Pipeline is under construction. The ACP/SH and MVP are proposed and under review by FERC and other federal and state agencies.

Stream Zero supports the case for a Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement to address the current rush to build large pipelines for the collection and transmission of shale gas. A comprehensive assessment of the multiple pipeline proposals is needed to objectively analyze need, alternatives, cumulative impacts, construction practices, and regulatory-system capabilities.

Stream Zero supports the view that pipeline industry claims to an environmental stewardship ethic are mostly public relations. The situation on the ground suggests, instead, a cynical lack of concern about environmental harm.



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
