Megan and Taina - I've completed my review of the MVP Study Plan for Spring Harp Trap Surveys in Greenbrier, Lewis, Nicholas, and Webster Counties (WV). Based on the variable weather in the spring, the Service has determined that spring portal surveys alone (for Indiana bats and northern long-eared bats) are not adequate to determine presence/probably absence. The West Virginia Field Office recommends that MVP conduct fall portal surveys to determine presence/probably absence.
