Elizabeth,

I have attached a map that shows the known locations of Fisher at Crater Lake NP that I consider to have some credibility. This includes:

- 1) 1 location from 1990 as part of a USFS telemetry study
- 2) 2 incidental locations (1 sighting and 1 track) in 2013. I do not know Terry Farrell from ODFW but I have been told that him and Everett would be able to identify a fisher track and they did give measurements. Greg Funderburk was the second incidental, Greg is the Park's fire management office and I believe he would know the difference between a fisher and a pine marten. He observed the fisher near our PCT trail and was able to observe it for a little while.
- 3) 1 remote camera location in 2014 in the NE part of the Park
- 4) 3 remote camera locations in 2015 in the south portion of the park (2 summer, 1 winter).
- 5) 2 incidental observations in 2015. 1 was by myself, I observed a fisher running across the road, clearly a fisher and based on size I believe it was a female. The other is by John Harwood....I am not as confident on this one. John is often in the outdoors and has seen pine marten. He was confident this was a fisher and I trust John enough that I will likely sample this area next year which is why I put the observation on the Map.

Let me know if you need anything else. I am at my Medford office on Friday and then gone next week to the Society of NW Vert. Biology conference in Idaho.
