I realize I'm going down a slippery slope here, but I will put it out there anyway. I noticed there are several questions that have to do with application restrictions already noted on the label, and it seems to me an important one that is missing is a question such as, "Can I sue Rozol mountain beaver bait to treat mountain beavers in forest plantations in California?" I realize that the label is pretty clear on where the product can be used, and it can only be sold to certified applicators, suggesting they should already know the answer to the question. However, there are other questions on this list related to application timing and rates, clearly spelled out on the label, and it seems like a question about where the product can be used geographically is an important one to add.

My understanding is that there is nothing registered for treating mountain beavers in California (or at least no ARs that are registered), is that correct?

Hi Sue,

Please don't hesitate to ask about anything. I think that's a good question and I hope my answer helps. Rozol Mountain Beaver Bait is the only toxicant registered for mountain beaver control, and it is only registered in WA and OR. The FAQ sheet will only be given out by our sales staff, primarily Michael – the one listed on the FAQ sheet, and his sales area doesn't include California. We only have two distributor locations, one in WA and one in OR, who we also might give the FAQ sheet to. The FAQ sheet will not be available publicly, and won't be on our website. So, the FAQ would have to go pretty far astray to end up with someone in CA. Anyone purchasing the bait has to provide a Certified Applicator's license for the respective state they are purchasing it in, which would be WA or OR. Certified Applicators have to keep records of when and where they apply the pesticide. It is possible that someone could purchase the bait in OR and then drive it down to CA, and then falsify their records about where they applied it, but they would know darn well that they are violating their applicator's license.

Does that address your concern?
