Hi Zach,

I have some information for you. I just checked with our plant manager because I was going to bring Nadine a sample pack of the bait, and he told me that he hadn't made any in two years and had none on hand to give me. Our distributor Helena only gives us an order when they receive one from a forestry company, since it isn't a frequently used product. That of course doesn't mean that forestry companies who had previously purchased it aren't using it now. However, as you and Sue had previously said, since it's an RUP, the licensed applicators do need to keep records of their use of it and report it to the state pesticide agency.

When a new order does come in to us, I'll try to figure out how to get some of that information that will be helpful to us.
