Hi Tried to call you, we have records from 2006-2016 of 63 grows on fed lands, not much data but my SA states that he has never entered a site without toxicant being found. As for non-fed "legal" grows I did a search on OLCC and found this. HUNDREDS of permitted grows in Jackson and Jo counties. All may be using toxicants, rodenticides in particular, but would not be detected in flower testing as rodenticides are on the ground in the grows. And OLCC only tests for one in flowers. Also the Klamath demographic area has been having barred owls taken for at least a year – these are right in the hotspot for Greta's MaxEnt model. We really need to get those tested ASAP – I think it will show how bad it is. David Wiens is doing the barred owl work, he has at least a couple of hundred in the freezer, don't know how to get them tested. Call. Me when you can. d
