Angela: I'm in the midst of my review of the fisher document, and as you can see in my comments, the document still appears to be light in discussing any of cleanup efforts that have occurred or are ongoing. To get whoever on the right track, here's the link to DFW's cannabis website. I didn't look at it in depth, but I do note that the 2018 annual report describes a grant program which funds cleanup efforts. It'd be great to see in the document a summary of cleanup efforts by DFW, Calfire, and other state and fed agencies. I'm not sure what exactly is out there, but I know it's more than what we cited in the document.

I believe a portion of the proceeds from legalization are required to go towards cleanup. I've just texted Stafford, asking him if a more comprehensive summary might be found somewhere online, or if he's got a lead person who can point us in the direction of readily available info.
