National Wildlife Refuge Hunting and Fishing Regulations 2020–2021







Divisions

- Delair Division (Pike County, IL)
- Cherry Box Division (Shelby County, MO)
- Fox Island Division (Clark County, MO)
- Long Island Division (Adams County, IL)
- Slim & Haps Island Division (Pike County, MO)

Public Use Information

- Delair Division NO public use allowed, except during state-managed deer hunt.
- All Other Divisions Where applicable, refuge lands are open for fishing and general use from ½ hour before legal sunrise to ½ hour after legal sunset. For authorized hunting activities, the refuge is open to access two hours before legal sunrise until one hour after legal sunset and in accordance with state seasons and regulations.
- Hiking allowed on refuge roads and trails, unless otherwise posted. ATVs/UTVs not allowed on the refuge.
- Dogs must be on a leash except for hunting purposes (where hunting allowed).
- Berry and mushroom gathering allowed for personal consumption only, not for resale or other commercial use.
- Electric motors and non-motorized watercraft allowed in designated areas for hunting and accessibility.

Firearms

- Allowed only during authorized hunting activities. Must be unloaded & either dismantled or cased when transporting on refuge roads or waters, unless in compliance with state concealed/carry regulations.
- Target shooting or any non-hunting discharge of firearms prohibited.
- When using a shotgun, hunters must only possess and use nontoxic shot.

Fishing

Delair and Cherry Box Division - Closed to ALL fishing

Fox Island Division – fishing allowed along any portion of the Fox River ONLY in accordance with state seasons and regulations.

Long Island Division and Slim & Haps Island Division – fishing allowed in accordance with state seasons and regulations.

- Must remove all fishing devices at the end of the day's fishing activity.
- Fishing is allowed from legal sunrise to legal sunset.
- The taking of any mussel, clam, crayfish, leach, frog, and turtle species is prohibited.

Migratory Bird Hunting

Fox Island, Delair and Cherry Box Division — CLOSED to migratory bird hunting.

- Long Island Division open to waterfowl hunting only from blinds constructed on sites posted by IDNR.
- Slim & Haps Island open in accordance with state and federal seasons and regulations.

Upland Game

Allowed for small game, furbearers, and game birds other than waterfowl in accordance with state seasons and regulations subject to the following conditions: stands, elevated platforms, and ground blinds may be put up no earlier than the opening day of deer season and must be removed by the last day of deer season.

- Hunting of furbearers allowed ONLY from 30 minutes before legal sunrise to 30 minutes after legal sunset.
- When using a shotgun, hunters must only possess and use nontoxic shot

Tree Stands

Construction or use of permanent blinds, stands, scaffolds or platforms is prohibited.

- Portable tree stands and blinds are allowed from September 1st though January 31st. The hunter's state generated hunter ID number must be permanently attached in a visible location on the stand or blind. Limit one stand or blind per hunter.
- Placing tree stands in dead trees is prohibited.
- Trees or limbs greater than 1" in diameter may not be trimmed.
- Deer drives are prohibited.

Blinds

- Construction or use of permanent blinds, stands, scaffolds, or platforms prohibited.
- Boats, blinds, blind materials, decoys, and other hunting equipment must be removed from the refuge at the end of each day.

Trapping	Muskrat, beaver, and raccoon trapping permitted	Cherry Box, Fox Island, Long Island, Slim & Haps Island Divisions	Special regulations apply and requires a Refuge Special Use Permit
Fishing	Allowed in accordance with state seasons and regulations from legal sunrise to legal sunset.	Fox Island (Fox River ONLY), Long Island, Slim & Haps Island Divisions	The taking of any mussel, clam, crayfish, leach, frog, and turtle species is prohibited.

Prohibited Activities

- By law, recreational activities on national wildlife refuges are prohibited unless expressly permitted.
- Possession of alcoholic beverages
- Camping and Fires
- Searching for or removal of any natural items such as antlers, plants, historic, and archaeological features, are protected by Federal law.
- Gas boat motors prohibited on refuges.
- Marking or flagging any tree or other Refuge feature with reflectors, paint, or other substance.
- Permanent tree stands, nails, screw-in steps, or other items that penetrate the outer bark of a tree.
- Construction or use of permanent blinds, stands, scaffolds, or platforms prohibited.
- Target shooting or any non-hunting discharge of firearms prohibited.
- Hunting is prohibited within 200 yards of any public use facility
