Drop-By Youth Fishing : June 3rd from 9am-3pm

Youth 15 years of age and younger! Stop by the Iroquois NWR Visitor Center (1101 Casey Rd.) to check-out fishing equipment to take out onto the refuge at designated fishing areas! All fishing poles, bait, lures, etc. are free to borrow for the day! Youth must be 15 years of age or younger to fish without a license. Junior Ranger Fishing Booklets will also be available to grab! Anyone 16 or older is welcome to come and fish but must have a license.

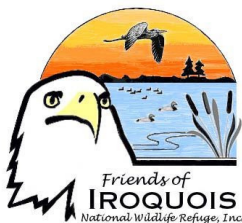
Nature Photography Class: June 24th from 9am-12pm
