Hi John - please see below regarding the screen (FYI I'm attaching the last version that BLM transmitted to us). Looks like there were two general comments that FWS is asking be addressed. I know that the net conservation gain concept is referenced in the mitigation discussion - we should make sure that's explicitly tied to (consistent with) the most recent net conservation gain language that resulted from recent leadership discussions.
