

There are currently no existing Coastal Barrier Resources System (CBRS) units in New Hampshire. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) identified one proposed new unit in New Hampshire.

The proposed boundaries for the New Hampshire unit would add 679 acres to the CBRS (121 acres of fastland and 558 acres of associated aquatic habitat). The proposed boundaries for the New Hampshire units would add approximately 3 acres of private fastland to the CBRS.

The proposed boundaries for the New Hampshire unit would add five structures to the CBRS (these structures are all park-related).



Proposed Changes by Land Ownership

The ownership type of the existing and proposed CBRS units in New Hampshire is depicted in the graph below. In conducting this project the Service relied heavily on publicly available State and local GIS data, which did not contain ownership information for certain areas (mostly large swaths of wetlands and open water) that are within the project area; and therefore such areas are categorized as "unknown." "Private conserved" indicates areas that are owned by private individuals or organizations (e.g., The Nature Conservancy and the Audubon Society) and held specifically for conservation and/or recreation purposes, including privately owned areas that are subject to conservation easements.

² Associated aquatic habitat includes wetlands, marshes, estuaries, inlets, and open water landward of the coastal barrier, but does not include open water seaward of the shoreline. This information is derived from an interpretation of base map imagery in consultation with National Wetlands Inventory data and other data sources as necessary.

³ Approximate structure count derived from base map imagery. Structures without walls and a roof (e.g., picnic shelters) and structures with fewer than 200 square feet are not included in this structure count because they do not meet the definition of a "structure" in 16 U.S.C. 3503(g)(2).
