Notice of availability of the draft revised recovery plan for red wolf

We, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, announce the availability of our draft revised recovery plan for red wolf, a mammal species listed as endangered under the Endangered Species Act (ESA). This species was once common throughout the eastern and southcentral United States, but is currently restricted to a single nonessential experimental population in eastern North Carolina.

Section 4(f) of the ESA requires us to provide public notice and an opportunity for the public to review and comment during recovery plan development. Additionally, we seek comments from Federal, Tribal, State, and local governments. We are particularly interested in additional information regarding the current threats to the species, ongoing beneficial management efforts, and the costs associated with implementing the recommended recovery actions. We will consider all information presented during the public comment period. Comments may or may not result in changes to the recovery plan; comments regarding recovery plan implementation will be forwarded as appropriate to Federal or other entities so that they can be taken into account during implementation of recovery actions.

Dates: To ensure consideration, we must receive written comments on or before October 28, 2022. However, we will accept information about any species at any time.
