Christopher,

I would recommend that the same mitigation measures used in state lease sales and projects (e.g., den buffer, requirement for Bear Interaction Plan) be at a minimum required in the 1002 area. Our state comments on the draft EIS reflect this. We also mentioned avoiding another "Deadhorse east" so that any new support industry enclaves go through a hefty scoping and mitigation process. We never had the chance to do that at Deadhorse since it was already up and running when we started. Landfills should be fenced with bearproof fences, and all the waste management stream should be in bearproof bins, including construction waste. The latter is a major issue now at Deadhorse. There are good bearproof bins for putrescibles, but the abundance of food remains in the open construction waste (plywood, metal, oily waste) create a strong attractant because people fail to use the bearproof ones. By having them all bearproof, there will be no chance for "mistakes."

All I can think of off the top of my head. Tomorrow I'm heading up the Dalton to Deadhorse for 3 weeks. If I think of anything else I'll get in touch.

Hi Sue,

I think we need to clarify that we aren't suggesting SAE seek lethal take authorization for polar bears during the proposed seismic survey in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge. What I was referring to is an intentional take authorization for polar bear deterrence. An intentional take authorization allows designated personnel to take direct actions in order to deter a polar bear. Authorized deterrence methods are all considered "less-lethal", they are effective, and when applied properly will not injure the bear. Some of the methods, however, have the potential to injure or kill a polar bear if used improperly. The designated personnel must be trained and qualified by completing our polar bear deterrence class. The class is usually about eight hours. If you choose to use firearms based deterrents, the designated personnel must be trained and qualified on those firearms. There are many effective techniques and tools to deter polar bears that don't require the use of firearms. If you choose to seek and intentional take authorization, in addition to designating personnel and their training, your polar bear interaction plan must include a detailed deterrence protocol that includes methods and procedures. We can help you with all of this if needed.

Under an incidental take authorization, no intentional disturbance of polar bears is authorized. During the course of conducting the activity described in an incidental take authorization a certain number of incidental takes is allowed. If a polar bear approaches a work area or other human-occupied areas, the only thing personnel can do is get to safety until the bear leaves. With an intentional take authorization, if a polar bear approaches, designated personnel can use approved methods to deter the bear. That basically means doing things that make the bear move away. Intentional take authorizations are intended to provide methods and tools to ensure human and polar bear safety. An intentional take authorization does not allow a polar bear to be deterred for the sake of project convenience or work schedules.

- 2) In Response on Question IV A, I'd suggest adding text on Alaska Natives as below:

This rule, if finalized, will not authorize any activities, only the incidental take of polar bears during the proposed activities. Additionally, the Service must determine that any incidental take of polar bears resulting from the proposed activities will not have an unmitigable adverse impact on the subsistence use of polar bears by Alaska Natives.

3) On Section X Further Information, perhaps adding some text noting that while the Service has had regulations in place in the SBS for similar activities, past regulations and the current ITRs have excluded the areas now being considered.

I had a conversation with Madonna Baucum yesterday about our information collection authorization (IC) for the BS and CS ITRs and if it would cover the ITR for seismic surveys in the Arctic Refuge coastal plain. Her conclusion is that we will need to update the current IC with the relevant information about the new area and activities. The good news is that the IC process runs concurrently with the regulation promulgation process, so there is no additional time needed, and only a minimal amount of paperwork. She doesn't see a problem with our proposed timeline for the ITR with the IC.

I also asked here about an IC for the Cook Inlet ITR and the process is the same. Since we'll be promulgation a new regulation, the IC process will run concurrently. In fact, it looks like we can amend the Cook Inlet ITR IC into the current IC and in the end have a single comprehensive IC. That will simplify the renewal process in the future.

Madonna attached a couple of documents for reference and to get us started.

In their response to our questions regarding the ITR petition, they state: "Similar to the shared FLIR survey program conducted by industry each year and by the USFWS in 2018, the FLIR survey will be conducted in potential polar bear habitat (based on USFWS descriptions) that occur within the planned operational area for that season."
- 2. Some revisions have been made to the "draft approach to estimating take" document. I will distribute a revised draft soon.
- 3. Unresolved questions related the the analysis include: whether Level B take of bears at dens will explicitly be included, and how take of bears in summer near the Kaktovik bone pile will be addressed (assuming SAE is willing to include summer activities). Some options may include: a. do not authorize take of bears at the bone pile (SAE will fly at their own risk). b. stipulate restrictions to prevent exceeding small numbers; c. authorize a limited amount of take near the bone pile assuming SAE will minimize activities near there.

Line Item # 3: We suggest putting archaeology and bathometry into the petition if you think you may do it after 2018.

As for the archaeology and the bathometry we do not intend to include those into the petition for 2019/2020.

Line Item # 48 and 78: The mitigations should include the community expectations. The village is integrated with the bears during whaling season, they should have input on mitigations and timing of activities.(specific to barter island). We would like to have the notes and or summary of meetings held in relationship to polar bears and who the conversations were with.

The POC describes the different phases of the communication plans. Listed on page 9 are the preliminary planning meetings that have been held with community, agencies and stakeholders. We are in the permitting phase of the project at this time. Discussion concerning polar bears and timing have not taken place and are planned for future fall meetings. ASRC will use the attached meeting format to document formal and informal meetings for tracking. Meetings that have discussion of polar bears and polar bear mitigations will be logged in with a summary of the topics and who attended the meetings. Any actions items and or requests such as buffers around village of Kaktovik or restriction on time windows will also be documented. ASRC will not be formally meeting with the whaling commission for winter seismic activities. There will be a courtesy informal notification. Most community communications will be with Kaktovik subsistence users, Native Village of Kaktovik, KIC and other winter season subsistence users in the area.

Debbie Nigro, Sarah LaMarr, Donna Wixon and I spoke to Christopher, Sarah Conn and Drew last week, we discussed our understanding that stick picking would likely be a stipulation of the BLM permit. It is a standard operating practice for most activities like this where there are camps, lathe being used to mark routes and avoidance areas and duck ponds being used under equipment to prevent drips and spills. The applicant would normally be required to go out in the summer time with helicopters dropping people off to retrieve any garbage or debris that might have blown loose during the winter or gotten buried by the snow.

Following my brief discussion with our archaeologist, I came away with the feeling that he does not anticipate adverse impacts to archaeological resources as long as known sights are avoided and minimum tundra opening conditions are met.

I will try to find out from the IDT if they have had a chance to review the lakes SAE identified as possibilities for drinking water. I believe the volume of water may be so low compared to the size of the lakes being targeted, that we will be able to predict the nature and magnitude of the impacts without additional data collection.

The near shore areas are another question. It did not sound to me like SAE was following up on that aspect of the project. When we met with them a couple of weeks ago, it sounded like they were dropping the discussion of doing work in the ocean during the summer, but did plan to use the coastal areas under frozen conditions out to the edge of the grounded ice- expected I believe they said to be at least at a depth of 10 feet.

Others often keep better notes than I do at these meetings. So much of the information is new to me, that I occasionally find my own notes confusing and jumbled. If others remember things differently, please chime in and I am happy to agree to corrections.

For two years of overflights with up to 15 landings a day they will need to conduct work in June or July only, or will need to remain 15 km or more away from Barter, Bernard and Jago Spit for the number of takes to remain small during Aug-Oct.

This assumes that 17% of bears exposed to aircraft activity will experience take, and does not account for any effective mitigation. There may be some info available for effectiveness of mitigation, but not sure yet, still looking into that piece.

In an attempt to keep your group in the loop we did receive answers to a few additional

questions that we asked SAE and wanted to share the answers with you.

Debbie

SAE would like to clarify with additional information some of our responses from the past few days between BLM and SAE on these topics/questions:

BLM: Would you please confirm that the proposed seismic includes all of the sea ice contained within the boundary of coastal plain?

To clarify, as in the plan of operations within the 1002 area, "Vibrators will only operate on snow covered tundra or grounded sea ice" (page # 9). It is also our intent to lay out recording devices beyond grounded ice but not further than the 3 meter bathymetry mark.

Regarding Bathymetry:

Our intent is to use existing data that has been collected by the traditional users of the area. All other bathymetry will be collected during our winter ice check operations. At no time will any vehicles exceed travelling on waters beyond the 3 meter bathymetry mark. It is our intent to stay on grounded ice in the lagoonal areas during our acquisition program.

Regarding Archaeology:

ASRC has commissioned two Cultural Resources Desktop Studies in the 1002 Area of ANWR. The first study encompassed the western-half of the 1002 Area and was completed in late 2017. Subsequently, ASRC commissioned a second study in April 2018 which encompassed the eastern-half of the 1002 Area of ANWR. Both studies include all known and identified sites from both SHPO and the NSB TLUI. ASRC also reviewed a third study conducted by the USACE in 2011 of the coastal area of the 1002 Area to ensure that all know sites were documented and captured. Through agreements with SHPO and the NSB ASRC has procured all the coordinates for navigation avoidance for a seismic program. During our meetings with the BLM these Cultural Resources Desktop Studies have been referenced. We have not yet provided them to the BLM and can do so without the geographic coordinates. ASRC is also aware the BLM archeologist has also requested all the sites from SHPO and the NSB and we are happy to additionally consult.

Regarding summer clean up activities:

Summer cleanup and inspections take place to visit all camp locations and areas of high use

from the operations to revisit and inspect and pick up any debris that may have been covered by weather and inadvertently left behind. The helicopter tracks the flight path and landings during the operations and that information is provided to BLM in a final inspection report.

We recently received a project plan for ASRC and SAE for a 2018/2019 winter seismic survey in the 1002 Area of the ANWR. We're therefore expecting an application for an Incidental Take Regulations under the MMPA for take of polar bears in this area which would ambitiously require us to complete the process by January 1, 2019. A critical part of our determinations in authorizing take of polar bears incidental to their activities involves a population estimate for the SBS population of polar bears. I understand that Jeff is working to update the mark-recapture estimate since his last work ended at 2010 and the new estimate should be available sometime around mid September of 2018. Unfortunately this has the potential to cause us significant issues given we'll need the best available information incorporated into our process by mid July and at worst, August 1. I know what I'm asking is no small request, but what's the possibility of pushing this to get something usable by July 15 - Aug 1, 2018? If that's not doable, can we setup a time to discuss options in the very near future?

I'm out of town from the 17th-24th. If we can't find a time to discuss on tomorrow, the 16th of May, can we setup a call for sometime while I'm on leave? This is pretty urgent on our end so I do apologize, but I can image you can relate. Anyway, let me know what works for you and we'll go from there.
