Seventh release adds, repeats and covers the entire geographic regions of the ArcticDEM production domain: all land area north of 60° latitude including all territory of Greenland, Alaska and Russia's Kamchatka Peninsula

The Arctic DEM team is pleased to announce Release 7. This completes our commitment to produce a high-resolution, time-dependent, publicly available Digital Elevation Model of the Arctic over the two-year term of the US chairmanship of the Arctic Council.

The entire ArcticDEM domain was re-mosaicked to **2-meter** resolution and covers just over **10%** of the planet. There are now over **260,000** total **2-meter** time-stamped DEMs that amount to nearly **160 million km²** and **200 TB**. The Arctic is now covered an average of **8** times by **2-meter** elevation data. All strips underwent significant improvements in filtering to preserve coastlines, fill holes, and better enhance densely-forested areas. The mosaic is now available at **5** times higher resolution than previous releases. Reduced-resolution versions of the mosaic are also available at **10, 32, 100, 500** and **1000 meters**.

On Wednesday, September 19, 2018, from 11:00 pm to 1:00 pm, at the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Alaska Regional office, Patrick Lemons, Kimberley Klein, and Christopher Putnam met with Jeff Hastings, Rick Trupp, and Sue Simonds of SAExploration (SAE), and Sheyna Wisdom and Justin Blank of Fairweather Science, regarding the SAE application for a Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA) incidental take regulation (ITR) for the incidental

take of polar bears during the proposed 3D seismic survey on the coastal plain of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.

At the meeting we briefed the SAE and Fairweather Science representatives on our analysis for the evaluation of take for the ITR. We focused on the analysis for MMPA Level A take (injury and mortality) and described our analytical approach, methodology, data sources, assumptions, and conclusions. We explained the criteria that we must meet in order to make the required MMPA incidental take determinations of small numbers and negligible impacts. We discussed our understanding that authorized Level A takes must be considered in the context of the Potential Biological Removal (PBR) of animals from the Southern Beaufort Sea stock of polar bears. We further explained that our analysis in the context of PBR led us to conclude that we could not make the negligible impacts determination with the information we currently have from the SAE application.

We discussed a variety of potential additional mitigation measures and clarifications to the plan of operations for the proposed seismic survey. At the end of the meeting we agreed that SAE would provide us with additional information and clarifications on when, where, and how they intend conduct their activities, particularly regarding the avoidance of polar bear denning habitat. We agreed to locate some additional data regarding a project that attempted to evaluate the efficacy of scent trained dogs and handheld infrared camera for detecting polar bear dens and to evaluate the detection rate of locating unknown polar bear dens with additional aerial infrared survey attempts. SAE requested, and we agreed to provide, information on certain aspects of our analysis for them to verify and aid them in their evaluation of potential project options. We agreed to re-evaluate our analysis with the additional information and see how the take estimate is affected.

We agreed that SAE will contact us soon to arrange a follow-up meeting with their designated science personnel to discuss our analysis in more technical detail and to further discuss options and potential mitigation measures.



Conservation Council vs NMFS 2015 - using PBR for Level A.pdf

Hi Mary,

To update you on where we're at after this morning's meeting, we looked through the Conservation Council of Hawaii vs. NMFS 2015 decision this morning and it's pretty clear that authorizing Level A above PBR cannot be argued to have a non-negligible impact. If you want to catch, you should read pages 18-46 but if you're short on time, focus on 30-46 of the case, which I attached.

We ran some very preliminary and rough calculations and even if we mitigated the activity to outside of a 5 mile buffer of the cost, we're still looking at 1.2 dens of the 2 dens that would occur outside of the 5 mile buffer going undetected by AIR. Those 1 or 2 dens would then still have an approximate 12% chance of being directly run over, and then the'd have another 15.6% chance of being disturbed in a way that results in abandonment of the den and death of the cubs. So, even if we ignore non-lethal Level-A, there's still a 25%-30% chance that a lethal Level A would occur outside of the 5 mil coastal buffer. Does that all make sense?

So, we'd like to setup a call with Ken Lord to discuss this issue, and particularly the case I mentioned above. This is to get his legal interpretation of that case and verify that it hasn't been turned over on appeal. If I was you, I'd want to have a conversation internally first. Would you like us to hold off on calling Ken until you have a chance to discuss? We could certainly put it off a few hours, until this afternoon.

For an update on the timeline. Kim is working up a new section for the ITR on assessing take of denning bears. She asked if she could then send this around for review before addressing the rest of the ITR. I thought that was reasonable. She estimated that she could have this completed by COB Wednesday. I told her to send it to Putnam and I and we'd turn it around hopefully by Thursday morning. If we're on the right track we think we could have a new draft ITR by Tuesday September 4th. Under the existing timeline, the ITR is supposed to be moving past FES on that date so something is going to have to give. I suggest we squeeze a few days on the RD side but mostly rely on HQ and DOI to shorten the 29 days they're scheduled for review down to perhaps 22-25 days.

Let me know what you think and if you'd like to discuss. We'll move forward with calling Ken as soon as we hear from you. We're also still on hold with calling SAE until Greg gives us the green light.

The calculations that your provide are correct. Perhaps the following language might clarify things:

Therefore, the PBR level for the SBS stock using the default assumption of a 1:1 sex ratio is approximately 15 bears per year. If this number is modified to preserve the female level, due to the importance of females to population growth, and incorporate a sex-selective harvest of 2 males to every 1 female (Taylor et al. 2008), the resulting PBR level would be approximately 15 bears per year (i.e., 7.5 females and 7.5 males) plus an additional 7.5 males per year, resulting in a total PBR level of approximately 22 bears per year conditional on harvest being conducted at a 2:1 male-to-female ratio.

Charlie you're right that this is a bit confusing due to the fact that the 2009 SB SAR included a PBR level of 22 bears per year *before* modification for a 2:1 male-to-female ratio. However, that's just a coincidence due to the fact that different input parameters were used in

the 2009 SAR. Specifically, 1397 (Nmin) * 0.5 * .063 (rmax) * 0.5 (Fr) = 22 bears. If a modified sex ratio had been used in the 2009 SAR, the resulting level would have been 33 bears.

I just noticed a sentence we have in the draft SAR that struck me as odd. In the below final sentence of the PBR section we note that if the number is modified to preserve females the PBR rises to 22 bears per year. Just wanted to double check this is correct, as the PBR in the previous SARS was a flat 22 bears, so with the reduction in population is this potential 22 actually correct or is it a residual/typo from the old SAR? Given the decline it seems high to me that even with a female preference it could go up 7 bears, but my maths skills ain't what they used to be....

Under the 1994 reauthorized MMPA, the potential biological removal (PBR) level is defined as the product of the minimum population estimate, one-half the maximum theoretical net productivity rate, and a recovery factor: PBR = $(N_{MIN})(\frac{1}{2} R_{MAX})(F_R)$. Wade and Angliss (1997) recommend a default recovery factor (F_R) of 0.5 for a threatened population or when the status of a population is unknown. In the following calculation: $(N_{MIN})(\frac{1}{2} R_{MAX})(F_r) = PBR$ (Wade and Angliss 1997) the minimum population estimate, N_{MIN} was 782; the maximum rate of increase R_{MAX} was 7.5%; and the recovery factor F_R was 0.5. Therefore, the PBR level for the SBS stock using the default assumption of a 1:1 sex ratio is approximately 15 bears per year. I have reworked the estimate of probability of den collapse. I am sorry to throw this at everyone at this point and not earlier, but based on my new numbers, the chance of a den collapse due to being run over is remote. Amstrup argued that based on the size of the footprint, and the number of dens on the refuge, there would be a high probability of a den being run over. Earlier, I had questioned where Amstrup got his numbers, and reworked the size of the project footprint to get the new estimate, but I didn't question what he then did to calculate probability based on the number of dens. He argued that the likelihood of a den being run over is 1-(1-P)^n where P is the probability of a den being run over and n is the number of dens. That argument is fine, but then he used the proportion of the ground covered by the seismic footprint as P. The 22% probability that he got for the answer is the probability that any piece of ground would be in a seismic footprint given n=11 surveys.

The actual probability is remote. Again, I'm sorry for the reassessment. The rest of the analysis stands.

Hi there stranger! I hope you are well. The answer is yes and no. In the right whale SARs we track:

Confirmed US Entanglements Unconfirmed first sighted in US Confirmed Canadian Entanglements Unconfirmed first sighted in Canada

We also track these same four categories for ship strikes. For entanglement against PBR we count all takes in the categories above except Confirmed Canadian Entanglements. Big source of contention when we count right whales with gear in Canadian waters that are informed Canadian gear. We count those toward our US PBR. So the only category that does not count against PBR is confirmed Canadian Entanglements.

For our section 7 consults we are a little more creative and tried to do a better job parsing out the Canadian takes but it's a reach (as you know).

Hello Patrick,

Based on your request a sub-set of the USGS polar bear research team reviewed the attachment titled "Denning Bears 11Sept2018 – All 26 pages". Given your timeframe and your request for an "informal" review, we focused on the following three questions:

- 1) Does the document utilize the most appropriate and current available science?
- 2) Is the approach technically and logically sound?
- 3) Are the assumptions consistent with the current state of knowledge relative to polar bear ecology?

Relative to question 1, all relevant and current literature and available science is cited. We are not aware of other important available publications (though note our reference to Durner 2006 below).

Relative to question 2, the approach outlined in the document is generally clear, well described, and logical.

One suggestion would be to incorporate denning habitat and the likelihood of use of regions within the 1002 Area to improve the robustness of the simulation described on page 12. Relative to denning habitat, dens occur where wind-blown snow accumulates to a depth sufficient for the female to construct a den. The simulation could be improved by restricting dens to those near mapped denning habitat (i.e., within 145m; 32 of 38 dens reported in Durner et al. 2006). Relative

to the likelihood of use, USGS does have data that might allow the estimation of the likelihood that a particular area of the 1002 Area is used by a pregnant bear. The USGS database has records of 33 maternal dens that were discovered through VHF or satellite telemetry from 1984-2014. Assuming that those 33 den records are not biased by human search effort, then a distribution of maternal denning likelihood in the 1002 Area could be generated.

Relative to question 3, while we recognize that gaps exist in our collective scientific knowledge regarding the ecology of polar bears, the assumptions that form the foundation of the analyses in this document are consistent with our shared current knowledge of polar bears ecology. Further, the caveats associated with the parameters were adequately described.

Finally, some minor editorial notes:

- 1) We recommend using a point estimate of 907 bears rather than 900 which is the point estimate listed in the IUCN Polar Bear Specialists Group Population Status Table based on Bromaghin et al. (2015).
- 2) On page 10 at detection probability of 0.62 was identified and based on Amstrup et al. (2004). As this number was not explicitly reported in the paper we recommend its derivation/selection be described in more detail.
- 3) It would be helpful to describe the distribution of dens relative to SAE seismic tracks in more detail on page 14 instead of just "All dens not detected by AIR or collapsed by vehicles are likely to be within 101m (300 ft) or less of a seismic tract".
- 4) The first full sentence on the top of page 17 that reads: "We evaluated whether den disturbances near pre-existing or recurring Industry activities had different outcomes than den disturbances **near** industry" should read: "We evaluated whether den disturbances near pre-existing or recurring Industry activities had different outcomes than den disturbances **away from** industry".

I'm not sure who has control of the master copy of the longer ITR document, so I'll just send these updates with reference where they occurred in the version used for yesterday's briefing.

1) Updated text on how I arrived at the estimate of 0.62 probability of detection from AIR surveys based on Amstrup's data. I would suggest the following text replace the sentence above equation 6 on page 10 of the draft IRT.

"To estimate the probability that a den is detected by a single AIR survey, we obtained data from Figure 3 in Amstrup et al. (2004) detailing the number of detections of known dens during multiple AIR surveys. We then used these data to run a binomial statistical model. This resulted in an estimate of the probability of a (known) den being detected during a single AIR survey being 0.62 (95 percent credible interval: 0.51 to 0.73)."

2) Mary commented that it would be desirable to know how many dens were under the simulated seismic footprints, rather than just the probability that >=1 den was run over. I looked into this, and there were very few times when multiple dens were run over, leading the mean number of

dens being run over to be something like 1.07. So we're really not missing anything or under representing how many dens might be run over. At least when we run it was only 8 undetected dens. If we were to bump up the number of dens beyond that, or change the distribution of dens to be more concentrated along the coast, we could see this change, but for now, I think it's okay as is.



Dear Mr. Putnam,

Thank you for getting back to me. Yes, please send me the final reports from LOA holders under the current Beaufort Sea incidental take regulation from August 2016 to the present. In addition, if you can send me a summary of the data from the observation reports, including the number of reports, the number of polar bears observed, dates, the number of "takes" that occurred (as defined by the Marine Mammal Protection Act and its regulations), and similar information, that would be fantastic.

In addition, I would be grateful if you can provide me with data on the annual number of removals from human caused mortality in 2016 and 2017 for the Southern Beaufort Sea stock, including how many from native subsistence harvest (U.S. separate from Canada) and the number from any other mortalities/removals. If you have any of that data collected for 2018 so far, that would be useful as well. I understand the draft 2017 SAR provides an average based on the 10-year period from 2006-2015, but it would be helpful to have the specifics for the recent years, if possible. (Also, it is my understanding that the SAR hasn't been finalized yet, but if I have that wrong, please let me know).

Our program maintains the reports you are requesting and we'll be happy to provide what we have. To clarify, are you asking for the final reports from LOA holders under the current Beaufort Sea incidental take regulation? That would be from August 2016 to the present. Or, are you requesting another date range? Also, we generally do not release the polar bear observation reports since they contain personally identifiable information from the company personnel who made the observation and submitted the report. However, we can provide summary data from the reports if you wish. We can provide the number of reports, the number of polar bears observed, dates, the number of "takes" that occured (as defined by the Marine Mammal Protection Act and its regulations), and similar information. If you are looking for something specific please let me know and we can produce a report for you. Please let me know if you have any other questions. Thank you.
