- Integrate artificial intelligence into conservation
- Leverage the power of social media to better engage the American public on conservation issues.
- Support technology innovation and software that would increase accessibility and house large data sets, species collections, and libraries of photo for within the public domain.

Subcommittee reports will be on the agenda for the next meeting and time for further discussion will be provided.

Co-Chairs will develop a letter to the Secretary. Stephanie Rickabaugh, FWS DFO, will provide the Council's letterhead.
