



Appendix E: Washington LSRCP Fish Hatcheries Operations and Maintenance Costs Summary

FY2009 Operating Budgets

Funding for operation of the state and tribal operated hatchery facilities in the Lower Snake region and associated support costs for fish health are derived from Lower Snake River Compensation Plan (LSRCP) fishery mitigation program funds through the Bonneville Power Administration. The two LSRCP fish hatcheries (FH) in Washington are operated by the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW).

Major Maintenance and Construction Costs
