

Federal and State Endangered Species ExpendituresFiscal Year 1995



Executive Summary

Purpose:

Section 18 of the Endangered Species Act (Act) of 1973 requires the Secretary of the Interior (working through the Fish and Wildlife Service) to annually report certain expenditures for the conservation of threatened and endangered species. This report presents the reported expenditures for Fiscal Year 1995.

Background: Only those expenditures that are reasonably identifiable for a listed species are to be reported. All Federal agencies and those States receiving Section 6 grant-inaid funds pursuant to the Act are asked to report. The first report for Fiscal Year 1989 reported expenditures totaling more than \$43 million for the conservation of 347 (63%) of 554 species listed as threatened and endangered as of September 30, 1989. The 1990 report tabulated expenditures totaling more than \$102 million for 477 (81%) of the 591 listed species. The 1991 expenditures totaled almost \$177 million for 570 (89%) of the 639 threatened and endangered species, and expenditures totaling \$292 million were reported for 679 (93%) of the 728 threatened and endangered species in 1992. The 1993 report tabulated expenditures totaling more than \$233 million for 750 (93%) of the 809 threatened and endangered species. The 1994 report tabulated \$227 million for 819 (90%) of the 914 threatened and endangered species. The 1995 report totaled \$312 million for 925 (97%) of the 957 threatened and endangered species. Since only a few foreign species are receiving expenditures from U.S. governmental agencies, these annual reports are largely restricted to a discussion concerning listed U.S. species.

Results:

Expenditures totaling \$329,678,510 (\$18,093,100 for land acquisition-Table 3. \$311.585.410 all other expenditures--Table 1) are reported here for 925 (97%) of the 957 threatened and endangered species. Expenditures are identified by species and reported separately for the Fish and Wildlife Service (Service), the States, and in aggregate for all other reporting Federal agencies.

The Service and 19 other Federal agencies identified expenditures for the conservation of individual threatened and endangered species. Another three agencies responded that their expenditures were not reasonably identifiable to species and due to the closure of the Bureau of Mines, no one was available to compile their report. Responses from all Federal agencies are included in Appendix 1. The median total non-acquisition expenditure was approximately \$30,000 (maximum of \$35.94 million spent on a species) per species receiving at least \$100. Six species (.63%) accounted for approximately 50 percent of all expenditures for which amounts were reported (Table 2).

A good faith effort was again made to develop species-by-species expenditures for this report. A significant portion of threatened and endangered species conservation activities includes law enforcement, consultation, recovery coordination and other actions that are not easily or reasonably identified to species. Accounting procedures by all agencies for most staff salaries, operations, maintenance and other support services are not recorded to species and are not required to be for purposes of this report. Despite the difficulty in attributing these kinds of cost to a particular species, better reporting techniques

have resulted in a report that most accurately reflects endangered and threatened species expenditures.

This report tabulates approximately seven times the FY 1989 expenditures (\$43 million), three times the \$102 million of 1990, slightly more than one and a half times the \$177 million amount in 1991, an increase of \$20 million over the \$292 million of 1992, and approximately one and a half times of that spent in 1993 (\$222 million¹) and 1994 (\$227 million). The Fish and Wildlife Service estimates that the bulk of these changes are from better reporting by the State and Federal agencies.

Due to an error made in the 1993 report this figure differs from the figure published in the 1993 report by less than \$10,850,700.

ENDANGERED SPECIES EXPENDITURES FISCAL YEAR 1995

PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

The Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.) (Act) was reauthorized and amended on October 7, 1988, under Public Law 100-478. A new Section 18 was added to the Act that requires the Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) on behalf of the Secretary of the Interior to report on certain expenditures on a species-by-species basis. The Section reads:

- SEC. 18. On or before January 15, 1990, and each January 15 thereafter, the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Fish and Wildlife Service, shall submit to the Congress an annual report covering the preceding fiscal year which shall contain
- (1) the accounting on a species by species basis of all reasonably identifiable Federal expenditures made primarily for the conservation of endangered or threatened species pursuant to this Act; and
- (2) an accounting on a species by species basis of all reasonably identifiable expenditures made primarily for the conservation of endangered or threatened species pursuant to this Act by states receiving grants under Section 6.

This document constitutes the seventh report by the Service pursuant to the requirements of Section 18 of the Act. The report covers Fiscal Year 1995 (October 1994 - September 1995), although some States may be reporting for a different fiscal year (without duplicating previous year's reported data).

The term "State" as used in this report is defined in section 3(17) of the Act to mean any of the several States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, Guam, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.

The term "conservation," as defined in section 3(3) of the Act, means the use of all methods and procedures necessary to bring any endangered or threatened species to the point where the measures provided for by the Act are no longer necessary--including, but not limited to, research, census, law enforcement, habitat acquisition and maintenance, propagation, live trapping, and transplantation. For the purposes of this report, the definition of conservation is further expanded to include any and all actions taken by Federal and State agencies on behalf of threatened or endangered species listed pursuant to the Act.

BACKGROUND

Defining "Reasonably Identifiable Expenditures"

The purpose of the above 1988 amendment was to obtain information with which to assess claims that a disproportionate effort is being made to conserve a few, highly visible species at the expense of numerous, less well-known species that may have greater need for protection. At the time of the first report, the Service met with staff of the House Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee and the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee for clarification of the intent and purpose of the amendment. As a result of these discussions, the Service determined that a good faith effort was expected to develop and obtain data that are

"reasonably identifiable" (Appendix 2). No extensive or extraordinary measures to develop exceptionally precise data were sought, nor was the reporting agencies expected to "pro-rate" staff salaries and other normal operational and maintenance costs not directed towards a particular species.

Since it is recognized that certain expenditures would not be included, this report is not a complete representation of all Federal and State expenditures for the conservation of specific listed species. The expenditures reported in this and the preceding reports do not necessarily constitute all expenditures made for each species. This report does not present cost accounting in the sense of an accountant's ledger of credits and debits of all Federal and State funds available and their expenditure. This report does represent a compilation of those reasonably identifiable expenditures reported independently by the various Federal and the State agencies. The report also does not include unrealized revenues from unsold water, timber, power, or other resources by the agencies reporting.

Coverage

Expenditures for FY 1995 (Tables 1 and 3) are reported here for 925 threatened and endangered species (97 percent) of the 957 species that were listed under United States jurisdiction at 50 CFR Part 17 on September 30, 1995. One species, Garrett's mint, had only land acquisition costs reported in FY 1995 (Tables 1 and 3). A few species, which were known historically to occur in the United States but are not listed in the United States, are not included (e.g., short-tailed albatross, northern swift fox, thick-billed parrot) in the tabulation.

Some vertebrate species (as defined under the Act) have more than a single listing in 50 CFR 17.11 where one population is listed as endangered and the other threatened (e.g., gray wolf, green sea turtle). For the purposes of reporting expenditures, such multiple listings have been combined. Subspecies are listed separately (e.g., Hawaiian common moorhen and Mariana common moorhen) when one or more other subspecies are not listed.

The Service did not report land acquisition funds in the tables of expenditures for FY 1989. However, other Federal agencies reported land acquisition costs in that report, and even more were reported in the 1990, 1991, and, most noticeably, 1992 tabulations. Beginning with the FY 1993 report, the Service has tabulated the known expenditures for land acquisition separate (Table 3) from all other expenditures. The Service's land acquisitions expenditures (\$17.09 million) have been included in this report, when they were identifiable to a species (Table 3). The present report has separated those costs; the total reported by the States for land acquisition expenditures is \$994,000 (Table 3) and \$10,237,000 for non-acquisition expenditures (Table 1). In this report for FY 1995, total reported land acquisition expenditures represent 5.8 percent of the total gross expenditures.

Expenditures are identified by species and reported separately for the Service and in aggregate for all other Federal agencies reporting and for the States (Tables 1 and 3). Expenditures for Candidate species or other species not listed at 50 CFR Part 17 as of September 30, 1995, were excluded. For example, even though Congress appropriated money for the prelisting recovery of Candidates, these species are not listed at 50 CFR Part 17 and, therefore, are not reported here, unless the species was listed during the year.

SECTION 18(1), FEDERAL EXPENDITURES

Expenditures by the Fish and Wildlife Service

The Service's operational categories of expenditures include fisheries, refuges, land acquisition, law enforcement, research, and Regional and field operations for listing, recovery, consultation, environmental contaminant and habitat conservation activities. All reasonably identifiable expenditures that could be attributed to individual species that were made by these activities have been included.

For example, reasonably identifiable expenditures for research programs included large sums for species where an intensive effort is underway to save a species from extinction (e.g., whooping crane, California condor) and smaller sums where only a minor research effort exists. The Refuge program identified specific listed species as a major responsibility of certain refuges. The Columbian white-tailed deer, Key deer, Hawaiian monk seal, and masked bobwhite quail are examples of listed species where the respective National Wildlife Refuge is devoted nearly entirely to their management and recovery. Other listed species use these and many other refuges for all or part of their life cycles. Only "dedicated" refuge expenditures that are reasonably identifiable to species are included in this report.

Listed fish species benefit from Fisheries programs, but costs are seldom identifiable to a particular species. For example, the Dexter National Fish Hatchery in Arizona has achieved a remarkable record in the propagation and maintenance of listed southwestern fishes. Attributing costs on a species by species basis for the dozen or so species managed at this facility is difficult. Few species-specific expenditures could be reasonably identified in the Law Enforcement program for specific endangered species. The Federal Aid portion under Section 6 of the Act for each species is included in the FWS TOTAL in Table 1. The State share for each species for which a Federal contribution was made is included in the STATE TOTAL column of Table 1, as reported to the International Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (IAFWA).

A significant portion of the Service's funds for consultations, listing and recovery are incorporated into salaries, operations and maintenance costs. As a result, they are not reasonably identifiable to species. Only salary, operation and maintenance costs towards individual species coordinators (e.g., whooping crane, red wolf, grizzly bear, sea turtles, sea otter) are included in this report.

Expenditures by Other Federal Agencies

A request was sent from the Director of the Service to other Federal agencies identified as likely to have some species-specific expenditures under the Act to report. The Service provided background information identifying what constitutes reasonably identifiable expenditures and how these were to be reported (Appendix 2). Three agencies responded with letters indicating that they did not have any reasonably identifiable expenditures for individual species and due to the closure of the Bureau of Mines, no one was available to compile their report. Correspondence from all responding Agencies is included in Appendix 1. The data identified by those responding Federal agencies for individual species have been tabulated in the OTHER FED column of this report (Tables 1 and 3).

SECTION 18(2), STATE EXPENDITURES

The Committees' staffs anticipated that not all States would be willing to voluntarily submit their expenditures for a variety of reasons. As a result, the Secretary was expected to only submit those expenditure figures that were voluntarily provided. In order to maximize the

return of information, the assistance of the IAFWA was sought by the Service to coordinate the reporting of reasonably identifiable expenditures made by States.

The States report to the IAFWA, and the latter tabulates the data by species and provides the totals to the Service. Total States expenditures are reported in Tables 1 and 3 under the column STATES TOTAL. Information was not sought or provided to the Service by the IAFWA on an individual State's expenditures or as to which States did or did not report.

SUMMARY OF DATA

Table 1 reports the reasonably identifiable expenditures for each species by the Service, other Federal Agencies, and the States; expenditures for land acquisitions are not included in this tabulation or used in the ranking. Species are grouped in the same general order as they appear in 50 CFR Part 17. Tables 1 and 3 also provide the rank for each species from Table 2. Table 2 ranks each species in descending order by the SPECIES TOTAL of Table 1; a cumulative, or running, total and percentage of the \$312 million total (non-acquisition expenditures) is also provided to assist the reader. Land acquisition expenditures are included only in Table 3.

A total of \$311,585,410 is reported in Table 1 for FY 1995. Some 97 percent (925) of the 957 listed United States species have reasonably identifiable expenditures reported from one or more sources. Six (.63 percent) species have reported expenditures that account for about half (49.05 percent) of the total amount reported here (Table 2); five of these are threatened species. Forty-one species (incl. three with both endangered and threatened vertebrate populations) have reported expenditures exceeding \$1 million (Table 2). One hundred and thirty-one species (14 percent of the list) account for 90 percent of all reported expenditures; species receiving at least \$100 in non-acquisition expenditures have a median total of approximately \$30,000 and a maximum of \$35.94 million (Table 2).

Below are the top 10 species with the highest reported expenditures in Fiscal Year 1995 (Table 2):

Despite the difficulties inherent in this reporting system, about 1 percent of all listed species received approximately half of the reasonably identifiable funding (Table 2). This conclusion was expected. The Congress and some State legislatures identify specific appropriations for most of these species, and State and Federal natural resource managers use the public interest in these high-profile species to help protect other species in the same habitats or imperiled by the same threats. The species identified by Congress as deserving of specific appropriations are the same species that drive interest and participation in the considerable State and private sector efforts on behalf of all listed species.

A good faith effort was made to develop species by species expenditures for this report. However, the information presented each year does not reflect the total governmental (Federal and State) effort toward threatened and endangered species conservation and presents an incomplete funding picture. Therefore, the reader is cautioned against making comparisons with other reports on threatened and endangered species expenditures beyond that which is provided below. A significant portion of threatened and endangered species conservation activities at all levels includes law enforcement, consultation, recovery coordination and other actions that are not easily or reasonably funded in a species by species manner. Accounting procedures for staff salaries and operational, maintenance and other support services are not normally creditable towards individual species totals. Also, there exists significant variability among the various Federal and State agency reports. Further, Agencies were asked to report gross totals for those other expenditures that could not be identified to species; this reporting is also incomplete but does reflect some of the levels of other expenditures being made by these Agencies.

COMPARISON TO PREVIOUS REPORTS

The amendment to the Act requiring this report was passed in the first quarter of FY 1989. The Service, other Federal agencies, and State agencies gathered the best available data with little opportunity for advance planning and coordination in that year. Subsequent reports have greatly benefited by the FY 1989 experience in planning and coordination with the reporting agencies to track such expenditures. An increase in future reported amounts is still expected as most Federal and State agencies increase their capabilities to track and report such expenditures and some receive additional funds to devote to endangered or threatened species. The totals for the States may change sharply in either direction as large amounts apparently spent for land acquisitions change.

Because of better planning and coordination within the reporting agencies, this report cannot be easily compared to the 1989 or subsequent reports. Real dollar increases or decreases cannot be accurately calculated or inferred from the overall or individual totals. For instance, large annual variations in the amounts reported on individual species often reflect land acquisitions and similar high cost expenditures that are not a part of normal ongoing conservation efforts.

The Service has provided previous reports on estimated allocations by species for the current or forthcoming years as requested by the House Appropriations Committee staff. The reader of this report is cautioned that there are important differences in the assumptions that led to each of these reports. The data in this report are more precise than previous reports on estimated allocations, since land acquisition costs are separated from general expenditures. However, they may be biased, since they only include reasonably identifiable expenditures. The following table includes data from the present and previous reports.
