Project Description: The project areas of this project are located within the Terrebonne and Atchafalaya Basins of coastal Louisiana, with Terrebonne basin having an extremely high wetland loss rate. Since 1932, the Terrebonne Basin has lost 20% of its wetlands and is expected to lose an additional 130,000 acres in the next 20 years without restoration efforts. Over the next 50 years, St. Mary Parish could lose up to 27 square miles without restoration action. The project work will enhance or restore 3,170 acres of coastal wetlands and help offset Louisiana's dramatic coastal wetland loss within these basins and provide quality habitat for numerous bird species and other wetland-dependent wildlife.

Project Description: This project aims to contribute to the regional conservation narrative through the acquisition and enhancement of lands destined for public use in the Atlantic Coast Joint Venture. One tract in this project, situated in the Lumber River Focus Area of coastal North Carolina and lies directly adjacent to Big Swamp, will be acquired in fee by the Open Space Institute Land Trust and passed through to the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission (NCWRC). This tract will be incorporated into the Game Lands Program for continued conservation protection.
