## Category A Construction or Development Activities

### Step by Step Guidelines & Conservation Measures

#### Step 4. Determining whether your activity is likely to disturb nesting bald eagles.

#### You have determined that your activity is one of the following:

Building construction, 1 or 2 story, with a project footprint of 1/2 acre or less.

Construction of roads, trails, canals, power lines, and other linear utilities.

Agriculture or aquaculture operations - new or expanded.

Alteration of shoreline or wetlands.

Installation of docks or moorings.

Water impoundment.

#### You have determined that the bald eagle nest (active or alternate) cannot be seen from the activity or project site and there is similar activity within 660 feet of the nest.

**Therefore, to avoid disturbing nesting eagles and their young, we recommend that you:**

maintain a buffer of at least 330 feet (100 meters) between your activities and the nest (including active and alternate nests), or if a similar activity is closer than 330 feet, then maintain a buffer at least as far from the nest as the existing tolerated activity, and

within 660 (200 meters) feet of the nest (including active and alternate nests), restrict any clearing, external construction or landscaping activities to outside the nesting season (outside the nesting season is from mid to late May through early to late September. Nesting season in the Southeast is generally Oct 1- May 15), and

maintain established landscape buffers that screen the activity from the nest.
