Draft Environmental Assessment for Limiting Mountain Lion Predation
on Desert Bighorn Sheep on the Kofa National Wildlife Refuge

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will be hosting a public meeting in Yuma, Arizona. The subject of the meeting is the recently released Draft Environmental Assessment for Limiting Mountain Lion Predation on Desert Bighorn Sheep on the Kofa National Wildlife Refuge. A 60-day comment period running August 4th to October 2nd has been established. The public meeting will provide a forum for sharing information and facilitating public input regarding this important issue. The agency will provide a presentation, followed by an open house. Agency staff will be available to answer questions following the presentation and will staff multiple information stations during the open house portion of the meeting.

The meeting will be held September 16, 2009 in Yuma, Arizona at the Pivot Point Conference Center located in downtown Yuma at 200 South Madison Avenue. The meeting will begin at 6:30 pm.
