

ENDANGERED SPECIES ART EXHIBITION GUIDELINES

Subject matter

Artwork should celebrate an animal that lives or migrates through the United States and its waters OR a plant or flower that is found in the United States. The main subject of the artwork should be an organism that is on the threatened/endangered species list, is considered a recovered species, or is considered a candidate species.

Artwork

Artwork **MUST** be original

NO lettering, words, signatures, or other markings can be visible on submitted artwork

Submit a photo of your artwork

All submissions to be emailed to arles@fws.gov by **May 10, 2019**

Include your name, school, and a brief description of your artwork

Digital submission must be **high resolution**, preferably at least 600 dpi

Accepted file types include: jpg, jpeg, tiff, and pdf
