

Mexican spotted owl Survey Training 2019

We will be holding two Mexican spotted owl Survey Training classes this year (and possibly one other in Flagstaff later in April, but the date is not set yet). If you would like to attend the training, please RSVP to Shaula Hedwall (shaula_hedwall@fws.gov) and send the name(s), contact email(s), and phone number(s) for each person attending. Signing up for the dates will be first come, first serve, so if you can only attend one of the dates, please sign up as soon as possible to reserve a spot. There is no fee for the training, but there are parking fees for the Flagstaff and possibly the Tucson training.

The first will be April 3, 2019, in Flagstaff, Arizona at the Rocky Mountain Research Station, Ponderosa Room.

The second will be April 11, 2019, in Tucson, Arizona, likely at Sabino Canyon, but we have not yet confirmed the location

- The training will begin at 0900 hours in Flagstaff and 1000 in Tucson (due to when space is available for the classroom portion of the training)
- The training will provide you with eight of the 40 hours necessary to conduct Mexican spotted owl surveys on your own or serve as a refresher, if needed.
- The training will go through the 2012 FWS Survey Protocol and we will visit a Mexican spotted owl activity center in the late afternoon. You can find the survey protocol at [Mexican spotted owl Survey Protocol](#). We recommend that you bring a copy of the survey protocol to the training, as we will not provide copies.
- Please plan on bringing lunch and dinner as we are going to fit a lot into a day and it will make it easier if people do not have to go find food (we could be out past 2000 hours, but will aim for an earlier hour to finish).
- Please wear/bring appropriate clothing (warm!) and shoes for the field portion of the class. Please bring binoculars and a headlamp, as well as any other field gear you might need. We will be carpooling as much as possible to the field, but some of you may need to drive your own vehicles. We will determine the safest and best way to get people to the field during the training.
