

This howling recording of the Blue Stem pack in Arizona was taped October 7, 2009, near the west fork of the Black River on the Apache-Stigreaves National Forests. At the time, the pack was known to consist of two breeding adults: AF1042 and AM806. And as many as four pups of the year. The Interagency Field Team captured one of those pups mp1183 and fitted it with a radio telemetry collar in September of 2009. At the beginning, you can hear the entire pack engaged in what's called a chorus howl where all pack members join in together as a pack. The pups can be identified by the high pitched howls and yelps as opposed to the lower pitched adult howls. Later, you hear only the two adult wolves together. Listen for the unique lower pitched howl of AM806 with its raspy growl at the end. The recording was made by Doctor John and Mary Theberge from the University of Waterloo in Ontario, Canada.
