SUBJECT: Trapping Orientation Classes Scheduled

Trapping and snaring orientation classes have been scheduled and will be held at the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge (Refuge). Trapping orientation is mandatory for anyone wishing to trap on the Refuge. If you have attended the orientation at any time in the past, you do not need to attend again, however; you are welcomed to attend for updates.

In order to extend the trap check requirement dates from every four days to seven days, you must have the snaring portion of the orientation as well. All classes will be held at the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge Environmental Education Center on Ski Hill Road in Soldotna, Alaska.

Starting Monday, October 22, trapping permits will be available at the Refuge Headquarters Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. for those who have already attended orientation.
