SUBJECT: Invitation for Proposals to Conduct Commercial Scenic Floating Services on the Upper Kenai River within Areas of Kenai National Wildlife Refuge

The Kenai National Wildlife Refuge is currently soliciting applications for competitively-issued special use permits to provide guided commercial scenic floating services on the Upper Kenai River. A “Prospectus and Request for Proposal to Conduct Commercial Scenic Floating Services within Areas of the Kenai National Wildlife Refuge” is now available for review and submission of proposals.

Interested parties will have over 180 days to submit proposals. Prospective permittees must submit two copies of a written proposal by August 1, 2017. Selection of successful applicants will be announced in December 2017. A total of up to nine permits will be awarded to selected applicants through this process. Permits are issued for a five-year period, with potential for re-issuance for an additional five years.
