Notice

In accordance with the Privacy Act (5 U.S.C. 552a) and the Paperwork Reduction Act (44 U.S.C. 3501), please note the following information:

- The issuance of a permit and collection of fees on lands of the National Wildlife Refuge System is authorized by the National Wildlife Refuge System Administration Act (16 U.S.C. 668dd-ee) as amended, and the Refuge Recreation Act (16 U.S.C. 460k-460k-4).
- The information that you provide is voluntary; however submission of requested information is required to evaluate the qualifications, determine eligibility, and document permit applicants under the above Acts. It is our policy not to use your name for any other purpose. The information is maintained in accordance with the Privacy Act. All information you provide will be considered in reviewing this application. False, fictitious, or fraudulent statements or representations made in the application may be grounds for revocation of the permit and may be punishable by fine or imprisonment (18 U.S.C. 1001). Failure to provide all required information is sufficient cause for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to deny a permit.
- We estimate the public reporting burden on the applicant for information collection to be 30 minutes. This burden estimate includes time for reviewing instructions, gathering and maintaining data and completing and reviewing the form. 2012 Waterfowl Hunt for Hunters with Disabilities
Fact Sheet and Application Instructions**

- **Weekend Hunt Event - Saturday and Sunday, October 13 & 14, 2012**
Hunters must have a Class A or C Disabled Hunting Permit to participate in the hunt. We will meet at the Refuge Maintenance Complex at 5:00 am on Saturday, and then head out to the hunting area for a full day of hunting. Sunday's hunt will be a half day, with a lunch provided back at the Refuge Maintenance Complex at NOON. This hunt is limited to 14 participants. If more than 14 applications are received by the deadline, then a random drawing will be held. Those not selected for the weekend hunt may select two days of hunting from the weekday hunts listed on the front of this application.
- **Weekday Hunting** - Hunters not selected for or not interested in the weekend hunt have the option of selecting two days to hunt from a designated hunting blind located at the River Bottoms area of the Refuge. Dates available will be Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday - October 16, 17, 18 and Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday - October 23, 24, 25. We hope to be able to accommodate everyone who wishes to hunt by offering this extra opportunity. Hunting will be limited to two hunters per day.
- **Hunting Assistants** - Each hunter may bring one hunting assistant or a non-hunting volunteer to assist them. Due to liability concerns, all hunting assistants will be permitted as hunters and will not be acting as refuge volunteers. Permits will be issued by refuge manager at time of registration.
- **Do you need assistance?** Please place a check mark next to the correct answer. Hunters may have only one hunting assistant to help them unless other arrangements have been authorized. Non-hunting volunteers may also accompany each hunter depending on needs.

Special Reminders...

- All hunters with disabilities must possess a Class A or C Hunting permit to be eligible to hunt in this special hunt.
- All hunting participants are required to have a Refuge Permit, a valid Wisconsin Hunting Licenses, and State & Federal stamps.
- Hunting from a boat will not be allowed, but a small boat may be used to set decoys and retrieve birds.
- Don't forget to circle your hunting preferences on the front of this form.
- For weekday hunts, you may hunt a total of two days and they do not need to be consecutive.
- Please fill out the enclosed application and return it to the Refuge by October 5, 2012. We will notify you of the results of the applications no later than October 09, 2012.
