Clarence Cannon NWR Deer Hunt for Persons with Disabilities.

A Recreational Opportunity for Permanent Mobility and Visually Impaired Individuals

Purpose

The Special Deer Hunt at Clarence Cannon NWR is used to help improve the deer herd on the refuge and provide for a recreational opportunity. This opportunity is being extended to a special group of the nation's population that has a permanent physical condition that severely impairs their mobility or vision. These individuals are fully capable of properly using a firearm to hunt game, but have restricted ability to access land for a quality hunting experience. This hunt is an effort to provide for proper access, facilities, and other needed resources so individuals with disabilities can enjoy a safe and successful recreational experience.

Description of Proposed Area

Located one mile east of Annada, Missouri, in Pike County, the hunt will take place within the boundaries of the 3,750 acre Clarence Cannon National Wildlife Refuge (NWR). The entire refuge is located within the floodplain of the Mississippi river where the land was previously converted to farmland and is now managed for migratory waterfowl and other birds.

Method

1. Centerfire rifle will be the only device permitted during the hunt. Legal centerfire rifles must be in accordance with Missouri hunting regulations.
2. No hunting dogs or other pets will be permitted to be used for the hunt, nor will they be allowed in the area during the hunt.

Bag Limit

Three deer, either two antlerless and one antlered, or three antlerless are permitted to be harvested by each hunter. Only one antlered deer may be harvested by each hunter.

Antlered Deer

*An antlered deer is defined as a deer having at least one antler, 3 inches or longer. The four point restriction **will not** apply for this hunt.*

Monitoring

The check station will be located at the headquarters of Clarence Cannon NWR. Hunters will be required to check in and out each day starting at 5:30 a.m. and ending at 7:30 p.m. Personnel at the station will be on hand to ensure compliance with regulations and safety during the hunt, as well as gather biological data for use by the refuge.

Season

The 2013 season is a 2-day hunt from Saturday, October 19, 2013 to Sunday, October 20, 2013.

Permit Information and Criteria for Eligibility:

1. Successful applicants must purchase a managed deer hunting permit for the State of Missouri. A resident permit is \$17.00 and nonresident is \$225.00.

NOTE: Permits must be purchased only if drawn for the hunt.

2. Applicants must be non-ambulatory or legally blind to participate in the special hunt. Non-ambulatory is defined as a permanent physical condition that severely impairs mobility resulting from paralysis or amputation of one or more of the lower extremity(ies) which require the use of a wheelchair, braces, crutches or other similar aids of mobility. Legally blind as defined for this hunt includes conditions where the better eye has a central visual acuity of 20/200 or less with the use of a correcting lens. A person with an eye which is accompanied by a limitation in the field of vision such that the widest diameter of the visual field subtends an angle no greater than 20 degrees shall be considered as having a central visual acuity of 20/200 or less.
3. Assistance for personal hygiene needs will not be provided by refuge personnel or volunteers. If necessary, the applicant will be required to provide his or her own personal assistant.

Application Procedure and Permit Notification

- The eligible applicant will be required to provide completed Quota Deer Hunt Application forms (page 5). All information must be received by close of business **Friday, August 30, 2013**.
- Ten (10) permits will be issued for the designated hunting blinds. Applicants will be separated into two drawings - one for mobility impaired individuals and one for visually impaired individuals. Five (5) applicants will be randomly selected from each drawing. In the event there are fewer than five applicants from either drawing, the remaining applicants will be eligible for the selection of the remaining blinds.
- Successful applicants will be notified by mail with a letter and packet of instructions enclosed. Hunters and their assistants will be required to attend an orientation meeting to be held at 5:00 a.m., Saturday, October 19, 2013. Orientation will outline the special hunt instructions and cover safety requirements for the hunt. A drawing for the selection of the days appointed hunt blind will be conducted.

Safety

Hunting Areas/ Firearms.

1. Hunters will be required to have an assistant with them throughout the hunt. The assistant will not be permitted to possess any weapon, therefore only one firearm will be permitted in the blind. Hunters and their assistants will be required to remain within their blind unless pre-approved by the Refuge Manager. The assistant may leave the blind to retrieve a harvested deer, provided they call the refuge personnel in advance.
2. Hunting from a vehicle is prohibited, with the exception of specially designed ATVs while parked inside the blind. Helmets must be worn when operating any ATV. All firearms must be cased and unloaded when transported in any vehicle (car, truck, ATV, etc.).

3. All firearms will be unloaded until the hunter and assistant are safely seated inside the blind. Firearms must be unloaded upon departure of the hunter and/or the assistant from the blind.
4. Cellular phones are recommended for direct communication with refuge personnel in case of emergency or if assistance is needed.

Hunter Orange

All hunters and their assistants must wear Hunter orange at all times during the hunt. Hunter orange must meet or exceed what is specified in the Missouri State hunting regulations.

Equipment Required

On each day of the hunt, participants will be assigned a specific hunt location with a blind set up. It is the responsibility of the participant and their assistant to bring with them any equipment and gear required to hunt and/or harvest deer. No hunting gear or equipment will be supplied by Clarence Cannon NWR.
