In accordance with the Privacy Act (5 U.S.C. 552a) and the Paperwork Reduction Act (44 U.S.C. 3501), please note the following information:
1. The issuance of a permit and collection of fees on lands of the National Wildlife Refuge System is authorized by the National Wildlife Refuge System Administration Act (16 U.S.C. 668dd-ee) as amended, and the Refuge Recreation Act (16 U.S.C. 460k-460k-4).
2. The information that you provide is voluntary; however submission of requested information is required to evaluate the qualifications, determine eligibility, and document permit applicants under the above Acts. It is our policy not to use your name for any other purpose. The information is maintained in accordance with the Privacy Act. All information you provide will be considered in reviewing this application. False, fictitious, or fraudulent statements or representations made in the application may be grounds for revocation of the permit and may be punishable by fine or imprisonment (18 U.S.C. 1001). Failure to provide all required information is sufficient cause for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to deny a permit.
3. We estimate the public reporting burden on the applicant for information collection to be 30 minutes. This burden estimate includes time for reviewing instructions, gathering and maintaining data and completing and reviewing the form. Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge Gun Deer Hunting Fact Sheet and Application Instructions

2013 Gun Deer Season

- **Number of permits available: 45.** Permits will be awarded by a random drawing to be held on October 16, 2013. If you choose to designate a hunting partner, each hunter must fill out an application form (applications may be copied or may be obtained on-line at <http://www.fws.gov/refuge/Trempealeau/>). Remember to put your partners name in item #7 on the application form. All applications must be returned with the \$10.00 administrative fee. Hunting partners will share one chance to be selected for the hunt. If drawn, each partner will receive a hunting permit. You may only apply ONE TIME. Multiple applications with duplicate names will be discarded.
- **Hunter Notification:** Permits for selected hunters will be mailed by November 8, 2013. If you wish to receive an email regarding the results of the drawing, please provide an email address in the space in item #3. Those hunters that are not selected will not be notified by mail.
- **Dates:** November 23, 2013 through December 1, 2013
- **Season Limit:** As per state regulations, one buck deer and an additional antlerless deer of either sex per refuge permit may be taken during the Gun deer season from November 23 through December 1, 2013. Hunters must have appropriate state tags for the deer that they harvest. Trempealeau NWR is in WI DNR Deer Management Unit #61.
- **Closed Areas:** Black Oak Island, and the ends of Delta Dike and Oxbow Dike.
- **Deadline to turn in application: October 11, 2013**
- **Fee:** There is a \$10.00 administrative fee for *all applications* upon receipt. Payment is accepted in the form of cash, personal check, or money orders. Hunters that fail to return applications with the \$10.00 administrative fee will not be entered in the drawing. Please make checks payable to: *U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service*

Additional Regulations/Information

- All hunters must possess a valid Wisconsin hunting license and a Refuge Permit to hunt on the Refuge. Wisconsin State hunting regulations will be in effect while hunting on the refuge. The Refuge will not be participating in the Hunting Mentorship Program. All hunters must be at least 12 years old and must be accompanied by an adult if under the age of 18.
- Only portable tree stands may be used and must not be left overnight. The cutting of vegetation for any reason is prohibited.
- Rifles are *prohibited*.
- **A Big Game Harvest Report must be returned for each permit (even if no deer was harvested) or the hunter will not be eligible for a permit the next year. Report forms are due no later than Dec. 13, 2013.**
