The 2015 - 2016 Mason Neck and Occoquan Bay Deer Management Hunts are coordinated by the Potomac River National Wildlife Refuge Complex, Mason Neck State Park in Fairfax County, and Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries. Read the hunt application form closely to ensure you apply to the correct hunt location. Incorrect or incomplete information may result in a voided application. Applicants ejected or prohibited from participating in ANY previous public managed hunt within Northern Virginia may be disqualified from participation and forfeit all associated fees.

Mason Neck Management Hunts: Monday-Nov. 16, Friday-Nov. 20, and Monday-Dec. 7, 2015. Bonus antlerless deer hunt for qualified individuals on Friday, Jan. 22, 2016

Occoquan Bay Management Hunt: Thursday-Dec. 10 and Thursday-Dec. 17, 2015; Monday-Jan. 11, 2016. If staff determines the hunt has yet to reach desired management goals, an additional antlerless deer hunt day for STANDBY hunters may be added on Monday March 21, 2016. All dates are half-day hunts ending at noon.

2015 Youth Hunt: Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries will host a Novice Youth Deer Hunt at Occoquan Bay NWR for beginner hunters ages 12-18 on Saturday Dec. 5, 2015. The attached application form cannot be used for the Youth Hunt.

Applications: Applications must be postmarked no later than Sept. 19, 2015. Only one (1) hunter name can be associated with each application. Applications from several people may be mailed in the same envelope and covered by same check. Your application receipt date will be determined by postmark – *Potomac River NWR Complex is not responsible for late or misrouted mail.*

Application Fees: A \$10 nonrefundable fee is required for each hunting opportunity on your application - Mason Neck \$10, Occoquan Bay \$10, or Both Hunts \$20. In accordance with the Privacy Act (5 U.S.C. 552a) and the Paperwork Reduction Act (44 U.S.C. 3501), please note the following information:
