## **National Wildlife Refuge 2015-16 Hunting Regulation/Permit Brochures Available Now, Printed Supply Limited**

Federal Wildlife officers have documented an increase in safety violations due to non-compliance with published regulations during the past few years. Many hunters have not read the National Wildlife Refuge hunting regulations and have often been misinformed about the regulations through social media. It is very important that hunters are aware of current regulations prior to entering and hunting on the Southwest Louisiana National Wildlife Refuges including Sabine, Lacassine, and Cameron Prairie.

In an effort to improve regulation compliance during the 2015-16 hunting seasons the Regulation/Permit brochures will not be available from waterfowl hunt access areas at Sabine Refuge recreation areas again this year. This change requires hunters to obtain or print the permit prior to accessing the hunt area and ensures that they have time to familiarize themselves with the regulations prior to entering the refuges. Additionally, the regulation/permit brochures will be available at eleven community distribution sites as well as accessible online through our web site.

The 2015-16 Southwest Louisiana National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) Complex Hunting Regulation/Permit is available to download and print from our website at <http://www.fws.gov/swlarefugecomplex> by clicking on the Hunt Regulations link found in the list on the left side of the home page. Then click on the hunt regulations/permit link at the top of the Hunting Information page. There is a limited supply of printed brochures which may be obtained from Cameron Prairie National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) Visitor Center, Sabine NWR office, Lacassine NWR office, the Louisiana Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries office in Lake Charles, Academy Sports and Outdoors in Lake Charles, Walmart Sporting Goods section in Sulphur, Cajun Grocery in

Hayes, Gary's Landing in Lowry, Cajun Fast Mart and Fisherman's Headquarters in Carlyss, and Brown's Grocery in Hackberry.

September hunt opportunities coming up include: Dove hunting at Cameron Prairie National Wildlife Refuge during the first split of the Louisiana (south zone) dove hunting season (September 5-13) and Teal hunting at Sabine and Lacassine National Wildlife Refuges on Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday throughout the Louisiana Teal season (September 12-27). Additionally, applications for the Cameron Prairie and Lacassine youth and senior lottery waterfowl hunts will be accepted September 1-30.
