Free Hunting Permit and Regulations 2020-2021

Established in 1990, the Ohio River Islands National Wildlife Refuge is one of more than 560 refuges across the nation administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. With 22 islands and four mainland tracts scattered along 362 miles of the Ohio River in three states, the refuge protects and conserves habitat for native wildlife in one of our nation's busiest inland waterways.

This document provides regulations for hunting on the Ohio River Islands National Wildlife Refuge and serves as a Refuge Annual Hunt Permit when signed. Regulations governing hunting on national wildlife refuges can be referenced in Title 50, Code of Federal Regulations.

In addition, all state hunting regulations and seasons apply on the refuge. Hunters please note, the refuge spans across three states. You are responsible for knowing the regulations for the state in which you are hunting.

Twenty refuge islands and two mainland properties are open to hunting. See "Refuge Property Hunt Status" section for more information. A boat is needed to access the islands with the exception of Middle Island.

Permit and License Requirements

While hunting on the refuge, all hunters are required to have in their possession:

- A photo ID
- Appropriate state hunting licenses
- A signed Refuge Annual Hunt Permit (this document)

Waterfowl hunters are additionally required to have in their possession:

- A Migratory Bird Harvest Information Program (HIP) number
- A signed Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation (Duck) Stamp

Refuge Annual Hunt Permit (No Fee and Now Online!)

Hunters may print a Refuge Annual Hunt Permit from our website: www.fws.gov/refuge/ohio_river_islands or pick up a copy in person at the refuge visitor center (address on back page). Permit applicants must fill in their name, address, telephone number, and signature before the permit is valid. Permits will expire on March 1, 2021.


Permitted Species

Only the following game species may be hunted on designated refuge lands and during the applicable state seasons: deer, waterfowl, coots, rails, gallinules, snipe, woodcock, dove, rabbit, and squirrel. No other species may be taken on refuge lands.

General Hunt Regulations

- All state hunting regulations are in effect.
- The Refuge is open from one hour before legal sunrise until one hour after legal sunset.
- Deer hunting is restricted to archery.
- Rabbit and squirrel hunting are restricted to shotgun.
- Nontoxic shot is required for all firearm hunting on the refuge. The possession of lead shot on the refuge is prohibited.
- No motorized vehicles permitted off refuge roads.
- Littering is prohibited. This includes but not limited to leaving shell casings, flagging, reflectors, and paint.
- The use or possession of alcoholic beverages while hunting is prohibited.
- Organized deer drives are prohibited. A drive is defined as an act of chasing, pursuing, disturbing, or otherwise directing deer so as to make the animals more susceptible to harvest.

- Dog training and field trials are not permitted.
- Dogs may be used for migratory bird hunting but must be kept under control when not in use. The use of dogs for rabbit and squirrel hunting is not permitted.
- Temporary stands and blinds may be used but must be removed at the end of each day. Permanent structures are prohibited. All tree stands and hunt blinds must have the name and address of the hunter clearly printed in a visible area.
- Baiting is prohibited.
- Camping, building fires, mowing, and tree cutting are not permitted.
- It is unlawful to drive a nail, spike, climbing screws, or other metal object into any tree or to hunt from any tree where such objects have been driven.
- All accidents or injuries must be reported to the refuge headquarters as soon as possible, tel. 304/375 2923. **In the event of a serious emergency, call 911 before contacting the refuge.**

An Important Message

The future of hunting on this refuge requires responsible hunter behavior and compliance with regulations. The Refuge Hunt Permit authorizes hunters to take specified game only. Harming or needlessly disturbing any other wildlife including birds, mammals, turtles, frogs, and snakes is a violation of refuge regulations and is a cause for prosecution.

Hunter Notice

Non-toxic shot is required because it minimizes the deposition of lead into refuge wetlands and bodies of water, reducing the risk of lead poisoning to waterfowl and other wildlife.

You will then be told when and where the bird was banded. A certificate of appreciation with additional information will be mailed to you.
