### **National Public Lands Day at DeSoto National Wildlife Refuge on Saturday, September 29**

**Missouri Valley, Iowa** - - National Public Lands Day is the nation's largest hands-on volunteer effort to improve and enhance the public lands like national wildlife refuges that Americans enjoy. National Public Lands Day 2012 celebrates service and recreation on public lands and volunteers are needed.

Volunteers will meet at the DeSoto Visitor Center parking lot on Saturday, September 29 at 8:30 a.m. Crews will work from 9:00-12:00 and complete projects related to trail maintenance and refuge clean-up. Registration is encouraged, however, equipment will also be available for any other volunteers that want to stop and help that day. National Public Lands Day is also a fee free day at DeSoto National Wildlife Refuge and other federal lands around the country. This is a great chance to get out and explore your local national wildlife refuge.

An entrance permit is required for all vehicles on days other than fee free days. The regular daily entrance fee for private vehicles is \$3.00. Permits may be obtained at the pay stations near the entrances or at the Visitor Center. The charge for commercial vans and buses is \$20, or \$30 if 21 or more people are aboard. Annual permits, including the \$15 DeSoto Refuge Pass, can be obtained at the visitor center.

DeSoto & Boyer Chute National Wildlife Refuges are located north of Omaha, Nebraska along on U.S. Highway 30 between Missouri Valley, Iowa and along U.S. Highway 75 near Ft. Calhoun, Nebraska.
