**Atlatl (\*)** - An Atlatl is a home-made spear that you will build and throw for hunting and sport. They were used long ago and they're still used today. This class is limited so register early!

**Black Powder Shooting** - We're going to teach you how to safely load and shoot both the traditional side lock used in the Civil War and the modern inline rifle used today.

**Handgun Shooting** - With experienced shooters, learn to safely load and shoot your handgun. Learn about different types of handguns and techniques for effective shooting with friends and family. We'll also provide you with a great opportunity to better maintain and handle your treasured firearms.

**Knife Making (\*)** - Join other ladies building your own knife using styles and techniques from history.

**Shotgun Shooting** - Whether you're just starting out or refining your shooting skills, this class is sure to make you a better shooter.

**Birding Techniques** - Explore forest, prairies and wetlands visiting birds in their habitat. Learn how to identify birds, use field guides and enjoy many days in the field.

**Catch of the Day!** - Learn how to clean'em & cook'em. There's nothing complicated in this class.

**Chickens** - From A to Z take chickens from the barnyard to the table and everything in between. Learn what it takes to build your own chicken coop, maintain it and to raise healthy chickens.

**Dutch Oven Cooking (\*)** - Prepare simple delicious recipes in a cast iron Dutch oven, over hot coals, using traditional & early American style recipes including stews, casseroles, & desserts. We guarantee you'll be surprised at what you can cook.

**Loess Hills History** - Explore the trails of the Loess Hills as we travel through time and learn how settlers experienced Northwest Missouri.

**Rain Barrel Making** - We'll teach you how to build a 55 gallon rain barrel to conserve water for outdoor needs.

**Fly Fishing** - Have an exciting day at the water's edge learning the rhythm of the rod to pull in those prized catches.

**Fly Tying** - Learn the basics to tie your own flies for fly fishing.

**Jug Fishing** - Experience fishing Missouri rivers and lakes in a totally new way. Join avid fishermen to learn this passive method of fishing for Missouri's large catfish.

**Kayaking** - Experience a quiet kayak excursion, learn how these open kayaks can be used for photography and fishing.

**Antler Art** - Liven up your home décor with your own creative antler master piece. Here's a chance to put your antlers to good use.

**Feather Painting (\*)** - Even those who are not artistic have found learning how to paint with Wild Turkey feathers is easy as they paint a beautiful wildlife scene.

**Photography (\*)** - Learn the techniques that photographers use to capture the vibrant pictures of wildlife then practice them with professional photographer, Carrie Wilson, who will offer advice and tips. Please bring your own camera.

**Quilting 101** - Learn the basic steps to turn your quilt block into a family heirloom.

**Solar Light Mason Jars** - Light up your path by learning how to decorate with mason jars and solar lights.

**Stones & Gems (\*)** - Gems, agates and petrified wood are beautiful natural resources that you can cut, shape, grind and polish to treasure for years to come, perhaps in a piece of beautiful jewelry.

**Willow Furniture (\*)** - Use Native willow to make decorative and functional furniture. It goes without saying, this class fills up early.

**Beekeeping** - Join the natural food movement! What does it take to keep your own bee hive? Learn from experienced beekeepers on which varieties of bees and flowers to produce the best honeys.

**Shed Hunting** - Deer shed their antlers every year in the spring. Take a hike with us as we learn what to look for and how to find the antlers that were shed by White Tail Deer.
