Aldo Leopold is considered to be the father of modern day wildlife management and of the United States Wilderness System. He was instrumental in promoting the Gila National Forest as a Wilderness Area in 1924, the first such designation. He also published the first textbook in the field of wildlife management in 1933. His management techniques are still in use today.

Leopold is best remembered for his vision of a land ethic and for his well-known book *A Sand County Almanac*. It has sold over two million copies and is one of the most respected books about the environment that has ever been published.
