

Artist-in-Residence to hold Workshop on Saturday, May 23, from 10:30 a.m. to noon at the Refuge Visitor Center

As part of this summer's Artist-in-Residence program at the Sam D. Hamilton Noxubee National Wildlife Refuge, we welcome Ms. Shelby Nichols, the ninth artist to participate in the program. Shelby is a 2015 Fine Art graduate from MSU and is researching and creating a body of work inspired by black and white photography by Ansel Adams, a prevalent landscape photographer during the 20th century. Adams's images brought attention to the natural beauty of America and its national parks. As part of her two week stay at the refuge, Shelby will be hosting a workshop at the refuge's Visitor Center on Saturday, May 23, from 10:30 AM to Noon during which the public will be introduced to tools and techniques used in photographing landscapes.
