KNWR is nestled in Idaho's Panhandle beside the Selkirk Mountains about 5 miles west of Bonners Ferry, ID. From Highway 95 follow Riverside Drive (on the south bank of the Kootenai River, just north of the Visitors Center) to the Refuge. Riverside Road turns into Westside Road at the curve just before you reach KNWR headquarters

**From South:** Take Highway 95 north from Sandpoint for about 35 miles. Turn left onto Riverside Road.

**From East:** Take Highway 2 west from Libby MT for about 50 miles. Turn left onto Highway 95 for 3 miles. Turn right onto Riverside Road.

**From North:** Take Highway 1 or 95 south from the Canadian border south about 30 miles. Turn right onto Riverside Road.
