Tony Mills Festival Speaker



Tony Mills, Naturalist and Education Director for the LowCountry Institute and host of SCETV's award-winning *Coastal Kingdom*, will close the festival with his presentation at 4 PM. Tony has been working in the field of environmental education for over two decades with emphasis on southeastern animals and plants. Before his position at the LowCountry Institute, Tony served as the outreach program coordinator for the University of Georgia's Savannah River Ecology Laboratory. He has written numerous newspaper columns and articles on local plants and animals and co-authored the book *Lizards and Crocodilians of the Southeast*. Research trips have taken him on excursions into the jungles of Mexico and Costa Rica to conduct studies on snakes and lizards and into the Everglades of South Florida to collect introduced pythons and endangered crocodiles. Tony's presentation will feature demonstrations with live animals plus video clips of shows featured on *Coastal Kingdom*.
