

Columbia Mine Preserve Hiking Trail Map - Public Use Regulations

Columbia Mine Preserve consists of 1,043 acres. This area was acquired in 2012 by the Sycamore Land Trust. Because the Columbia Mine Preserve is privately owned, this area is subject to **different public access and use regulations**. Public use is managed through a cooperative agreement with Patoka River National Wildlife Refuge and Management Area.

The Columbia Mine Unit is open from one-half hour before legal sunrise to one-half hour after legal sunset.

The following activities are **prohibited** on Columbia Mine Preserve

Hunting Dates On Columbia Mine Preserve for the 2016-2017 Season

Columbia Mine Preserve is **closed to hunting all game animals** except for:

1. White-tailed deer during the first week (7 days) of the State-defined seasons for
Archery October 1 – 7, 2016
Firearms November 12 – 18, 2016
Muzzleloader December 3 – 9, 2016
2. Wild turkey only during the State-defined spring season (April 26 – May 14, 2017). Fall season wild turkey hunting is prohibited.

All visitors in the field must wear fluorescent orange hat or vest during the above listed hunting dates.

Please take notice: All general refuge public use regulations apply when on the Columbia Mine Preserve. Enforcement of use regulations will be carried out by both Federal and State Conservation Officers. ***Hunting and fishing regulations are covered in a separate brochure available at the Refuge Office.***
