

General Refuge Information

- The refuge is open for use during daylight hours.
- Refuge office hours are Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
- The use or possession of alcoholic beverages is prohibited on national wildlife refuges.
- Camping, campfires, and overnight parking are prohibited.
- Target shooting is prohibited.
- Motorized vehicles are prohibited, except on designated parking areas and public roads.
- See map on the back of this sheet for areas open to hunting.

General Hunting Regulations

- All hunters must be licensed and abide by all applicable federal and state regulations.
- The refuge is open for hunting by youth or disabled hunters only, on a regulated basis.
- All shotgun hunters must use non-toxic shot.
- Refuge hunting hours follow those set in the Minnesota State Hunting Regulations Handbook.
- In addition to the required state licenses and stamps, hunters on Crane Meadows NWR must obtain a permit or notification issued by the refuge for all hunting activities.
- Permanent stands are prohibited.
- Portable stands or temporary blinds are permitted, but must be removed at the end of each day.
- Nails, wire, bolts or screw-in steps may not be used to attach a stand or to support a hunter or equipment.
- Baiting of any kind is not permitted.
- A Hunter Orientation will be provided to individuals selected for a hunt.

Deer Hunting on the Refuge – Rifle

- A white-tailed deer hunt is offered to persons with disabilities.
- Dates of the hunt will vary from year to year, but typically will be held during the first few weeks of October.
- Each hunter will be assigned a hunting blind.
- Hunting is restricted to blinds located in shooting areas established on the refuge.

Spring Wild Turkey Hunt for People with Disabilities

- Wild turkey hunting is offered to hunters with disabilities or mobility-impairments.
- Hunt dates will mimic those set by the State of Minnesota.
- Each hunter will be assigned a hunting blind.
