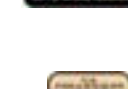


February 8: Stories at the Marsh: Groundhogs 10-11am.

March 3: Nestbox Seminar 9am-1pm. Learn about cavity nesting birds and how you can help.

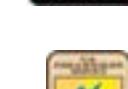
