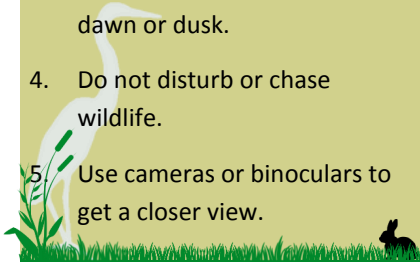

TIPS: VIEWING WILDLIFE

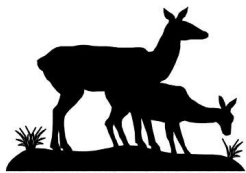
Here are some tips for viewing wildlife on our 2.5 mile trail system.

1. Be quiet. Move slowly and casually.
2. Be patient.
3. Wildlife are most active during dawn or dusk.
4. Do not disturb or chase wildlife.
5. Use cameras or binoculars to get a closer view.

Approaching, feeding, or following wild animals can alter their natural habits. Watch from a distance, store food tightly and well out of reach, and control pets at all times or consider leaving them at home.
