Volunteer Kristin Purdy conducted a general bird survey (non-waterbird) on the refuge on April 3, 2013, recording 14 species. Several early-breeding species are singing on territory, including marsh wrens, song and savannah sparrows, and red-winged and yellow-headed blackbirds. Migrant swallows (tree) and breeding swallows (cliff) are concentrating at water control structures. A late Rough-legged hawk was observed along the auto tour loop.
