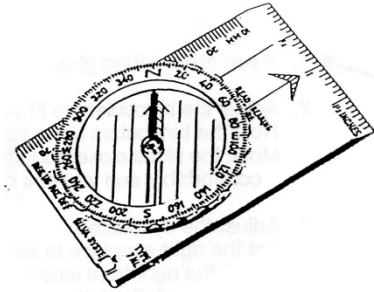
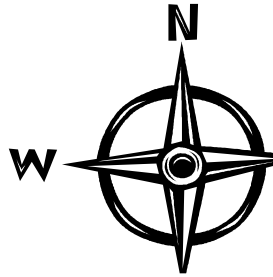
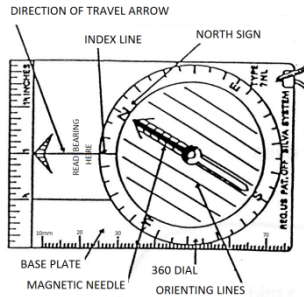


How to Use a Compass

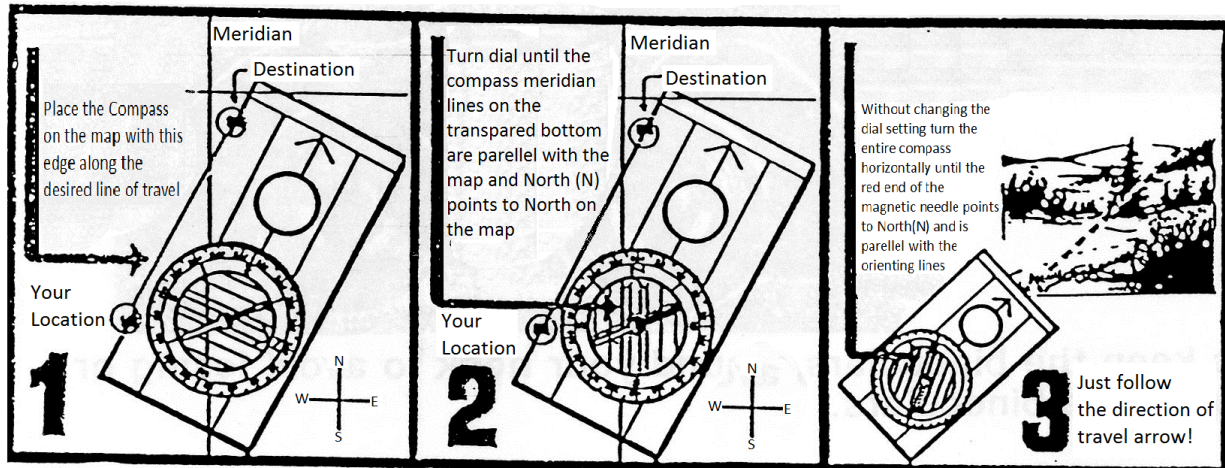


To find North: Hold the compass horizontally then rotate until the red arrow points to the red “N”

To Follow a Bearing

Select a bearing (for example NW or 60). Rotate DIAL on the compass until chosen bearing lines align with index line. Then hold the compass horizontally then rotate until the red arrow points to the red “N”. The Direction of Travel arrow is now facing your selected bearing.

To determine which direction a landmark is in relation to you, face the landmark. Holding the compass level point the Direction of Travel Arrow toward the landmark. Adjust the dial so that the red ‘N’ matches up with the Red Needle.

HOW TO USE BINOCULARS

1. Adjust the binoculars to fit you.

- Hold the binoculars up to your eyes and grasp each side firmly.
- Move the sides closer together or farther apart until they fit your eyes comfortably and you see only one round image.



2. Adjust the eyepieces

- Set the **right** eyepiece to **zero**
- Cover the **right front lens** with your hand
- Look through the **left eyepiece** and use the focusing lever in the **middle** of the binoculars to focus on a distant object
- Keep **both** eyes open while doing this
- Now cover the **left front lens** with your hand and rotate the right eyepiece from zero to plus or minus until the same distant image is sharp in your right eye.

3. Use the middle lever to focus on different distances.



*Always keep the binoculars around your neck to avoid losing or dropping the binoculars.

*Avoid getting the binoculars wet or dirty

*Avoid looking at the sun.
