Monomoy National Wildlife Refuge Seeking Public Input for Hunt Plan

Monomoy National Wildlife Refuge will facilitate one public information session to outline the proposed refuge hunt plan and seek public input on issues and concerns related to the environmental assessment and compatibility determination. The refuge proposes opening a public use hunt program for migratory waterfowl and coyote. The objective of the hunting program is to provide the public with high-quality, wildlife-oriented recreation.

The walk-in information session will be held in the large room at the Chatham Community Center (702 Main Street Chatham, MA 02633) on April 30th from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm. Members of the public are invited to attend at any time within that 3-hr window.
