## Which birds can you find?

Some birds are easy to see. Others are secretive and hard to find. Do you know a bird species that only comes out at night? Good bird watchers look for many different clues to learn if a bird lives in the area. They listen for songs and calls. They look for nests, tracks, pellets or droppings. Keep your eyes and ears open and you may see, hear or find evidence of all the birds on this list.

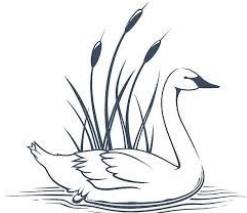

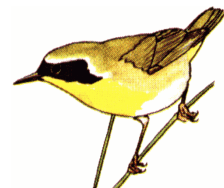
