





Boyd – Maxey – Otter Run – South Fork Hiking Trail Map - Public Use Regulations

Patoka River National Wildlife Refuge and Management Area, established September 7, 1994, is located in Gibson and Pike Counties along the Patoka River in southwest Indiana. *Public hunting is not allowed on the Boyd, Maxey and part of Otter Run trails. See reverse side of map showing no hunting area.*

The Refuge is open from one-half hour before legal sunrise to one-half hour after legal sunset.

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Littering/dumping.• Use or possession of alcoholic beverages.• Target practice or random shooting.• Camping/overnight parking.• Campfires.• Swimming.• Use of fireworks.• Dogs running loose or not on leash.• Taking or attempting to take any wildlife or wildlife parts (e.g. shed antlers).• Trapping furbearers or other animals. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Taking, cutting or destroying any plants or parts thereof including flowers, fruits, nuts, fungi, herbs, shrubs, or trees.• Use of off-road vehicles, horses, mules, llamas, and bicycles other than on maintained county road right-of-ways.• Blocking gates or roadways with vehicles.• Searching for or removing any object of antiquity including arrowheads, pottery, beads, etc. Use of metal detectors or digging for artifacts.• Use of airboats and gasoline-powered boat motors except on Snakey Point east of the South Fork.• Boats must be clean and free of any plant or animal material or water before entering water bodies. |

Safety Notice: ALL VISITORS in the field must wear Fluorescent Orange Hat or Vest Mandatory in areas open to hunting during hunting season.

Please take notice: All general refuge public use regulations apply. Enforcement of use regulations will be carried out by both Federal and State Conservation Officers. Hunting and fishing regulations are covered in a separate brochure available at the Refuge Office.
