Caring for Monarch Caterpillars

Training Description

Get some tips and tricks on responsibly rearing wild-caught monarch eggs and caterpillars to further ensure their survival. If you want to try properly rearing monarchs yourself, often receive questions from the public about it, or need troubleshooting assistance, this webinar is for you! Two USFWS star volunteers will share their processes, home set-up, and documentation along with two Service employees. Also, find out about the tagging program through Monarch Watch and how to order tags for your butterflies so you are ready for tagging season later in summer.
