



## **Siletz Bay Paddle Tours**

### **Guided Paddle Trips with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Summer 2018**

#### **Interested in getting on the water this summer?**

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service invites you to explore Siletz Bay National Wildlife Refuge with a guided paddle trip between June and August. These roughly two-hour trips will take visitors through the heart of Siletz Bay, all the while learning about the Refuge's wildlife and natural history from U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Interpreters.

Siletz Bay is one of numerous estuaries located along the Pacific Coast Scenic Byway. On either side of Highway 101, starchy skeleton trees jut forth from the estuary and are reminiscent of a time when the salt marsh was diked for pasture. Osprey, Red-tailed Hawk, and occasionally Bald Eagle can be seen roosting at the top of these snags. A variety of estuarine-dependent birds including Great Blue Heron, Great Egret, and some species of waterfowl can be seen foraging in the tidal waters. Songbird choruses accompany paddlers throughout their trip, including Purple Martin, Song Sparrow, Marsh and Pacific Wren, Pacific-slope Flycatcher, and Cedar Waxwing.

These paddles are free for the public but registration is required. Registration instructions are below. The Bay often experiences unpredictable winds and waves, and for this reason the paddle is not recommended for beginners.

3. **We do not provide boats.** If you have a personal non-motorized boat, you may use that. If you need to rent one, there are many rental shops in the surrounding area. A few suggestions for canoe and kayak rental are listed below.
